2. Countryside and location
3. School

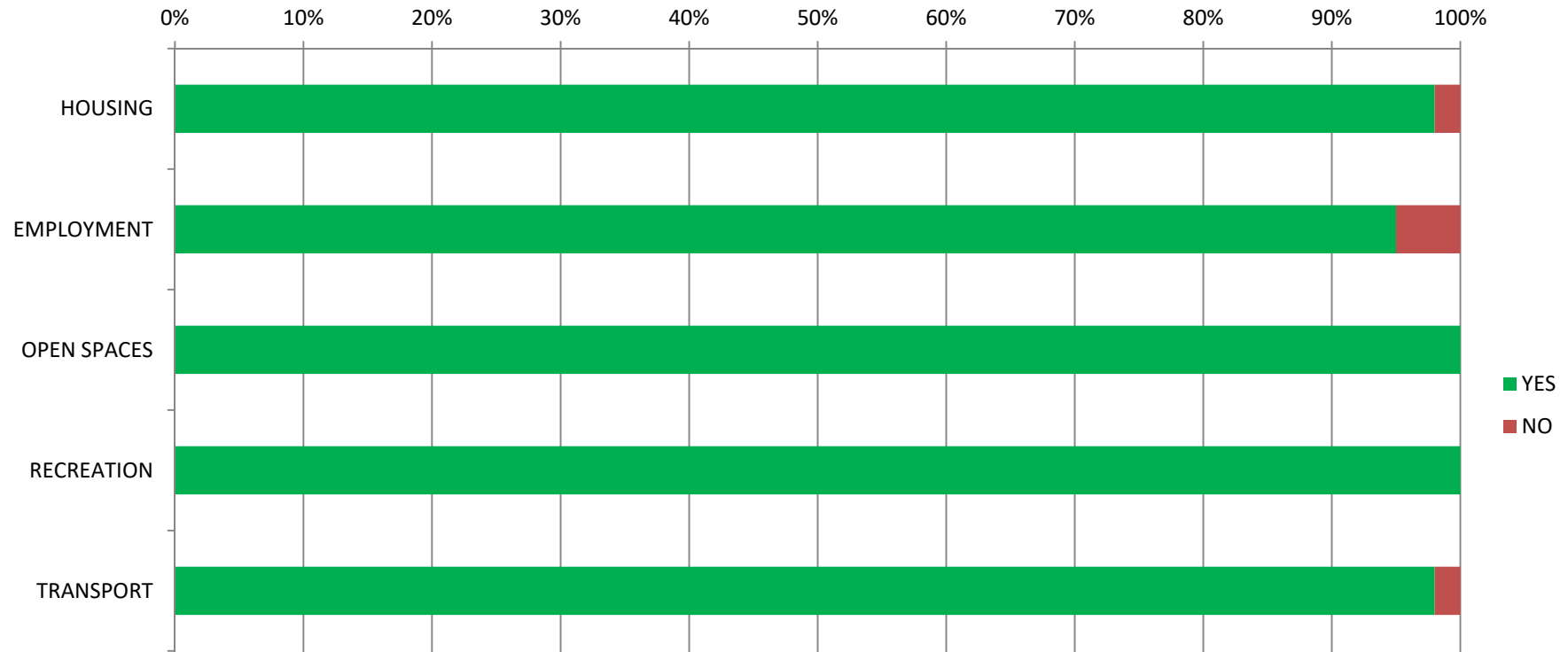
The things most disliked
(in order of importance)

1. Traffic and ineffective calming measures
2. Lack of facilities (shop)
3. Encroachment from Carterton
4. Lack of safe recreation space/footpaths
5. Noise and fumes from the airfield

The things that the community
would change (in order of importance)

1. Have a village shop/post office/café
2. Improve roads and traffic calming measures
3. Improve footpaths and cycle paths

Do you consider Brize Norton Neighbourhood Plan should contain policies on the topics below?

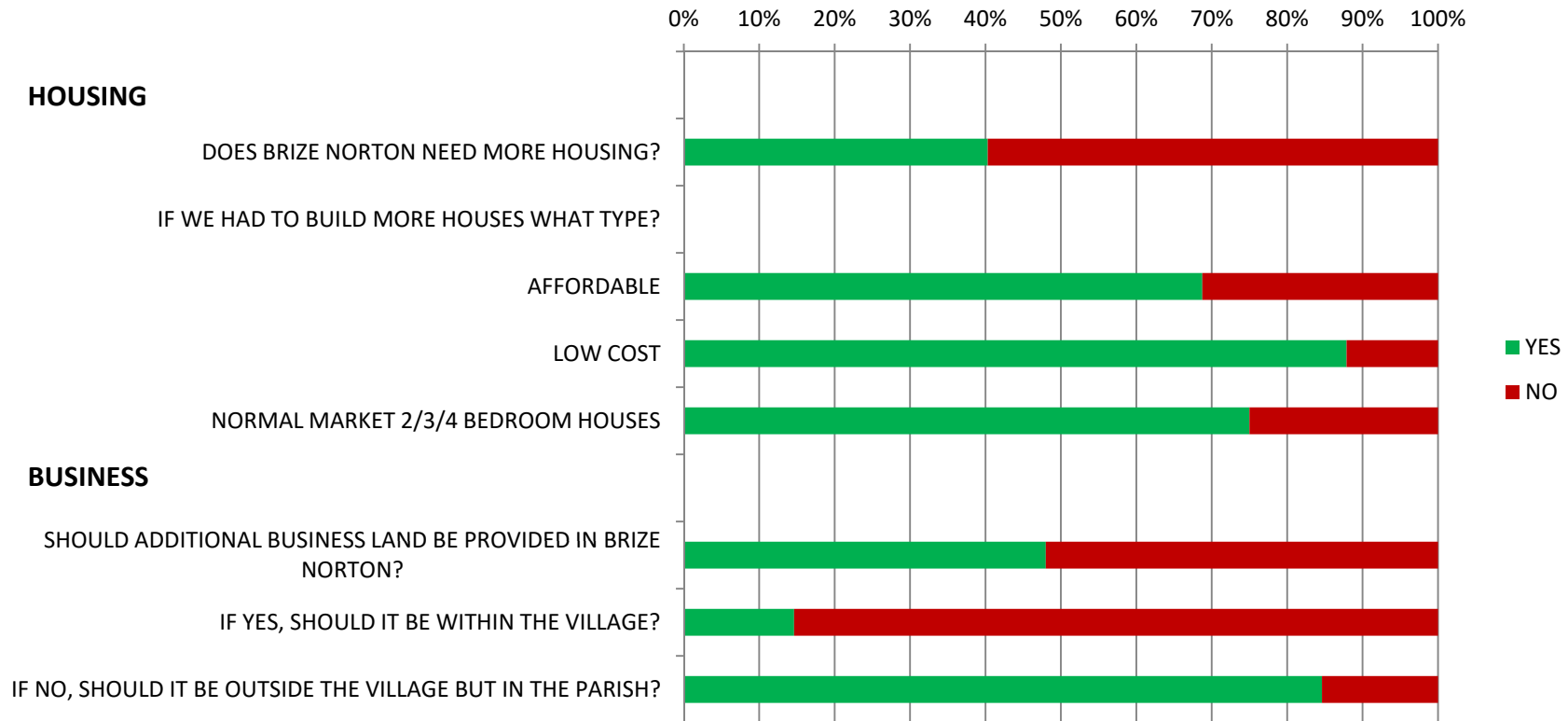

There is an overwhelming majority by the community that the Neighbourhood Plan should contain policies relating to all the above topics.

PLANNING

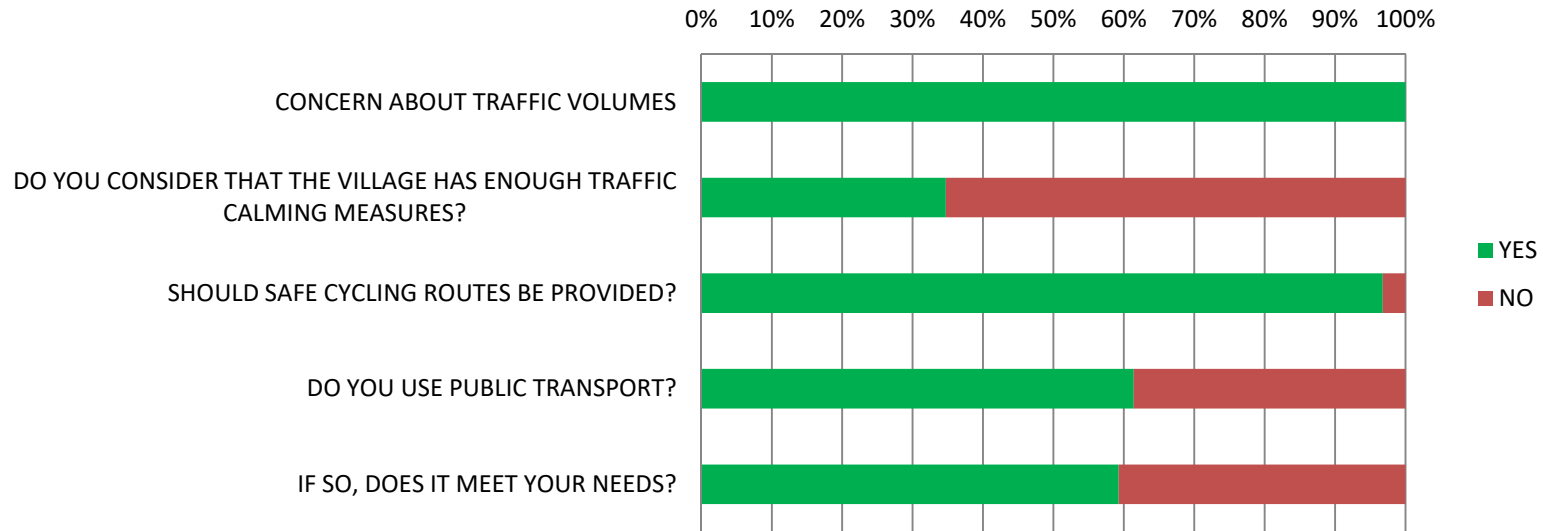

CONCLUSIONS

1. The majority of the community consider that additional housing is not required (There are 700 houses coming!)
2. If they were to be built, the majority would prefer they were for first time buyers
3. The community is equally divided about business land
4. If business land was to be provided there is a clear message that this should be outside the village but within the Parish

TRANSPORT & MOVEMENT

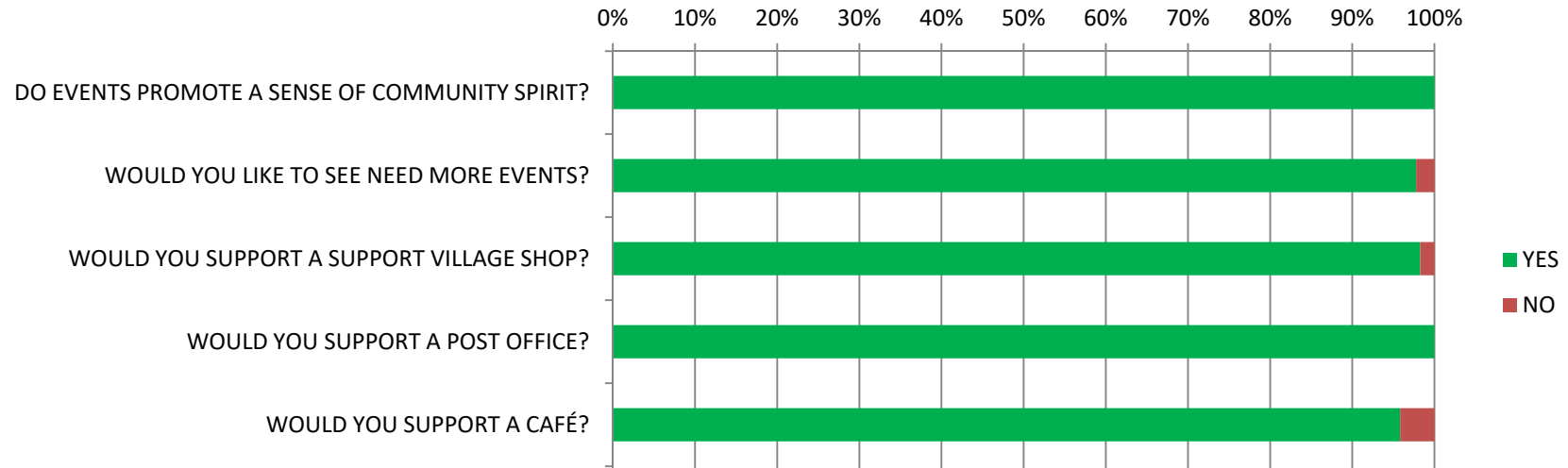

CONCLUSIONS

1. There is a clear concern about traffic volumes in the village (This is before the 2,552 homes and 10 hectares of business land to be developed)
2. There is a high demand for cycling routes for commuting
3. The current bus service meets the needs of most of the community
4. A high level of verbatims were provided for improving traffic calming measures and enforcing speed limits

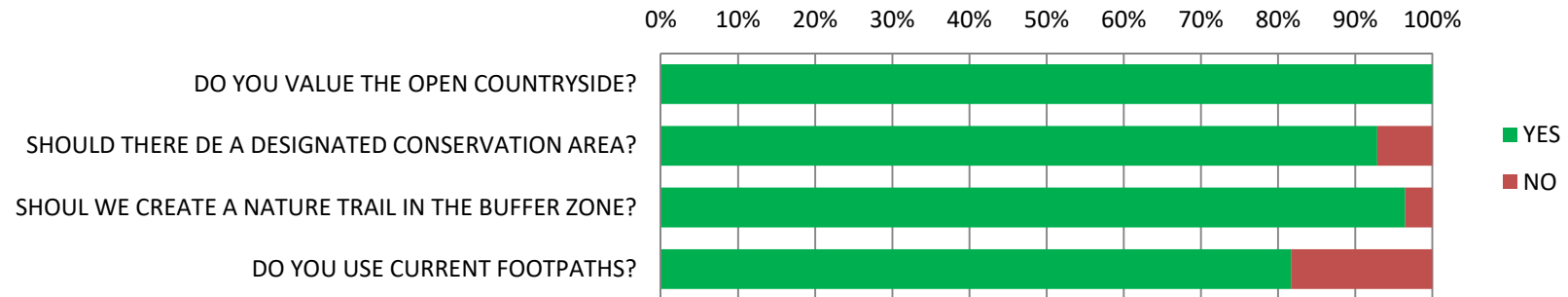

CONCLUSIONS

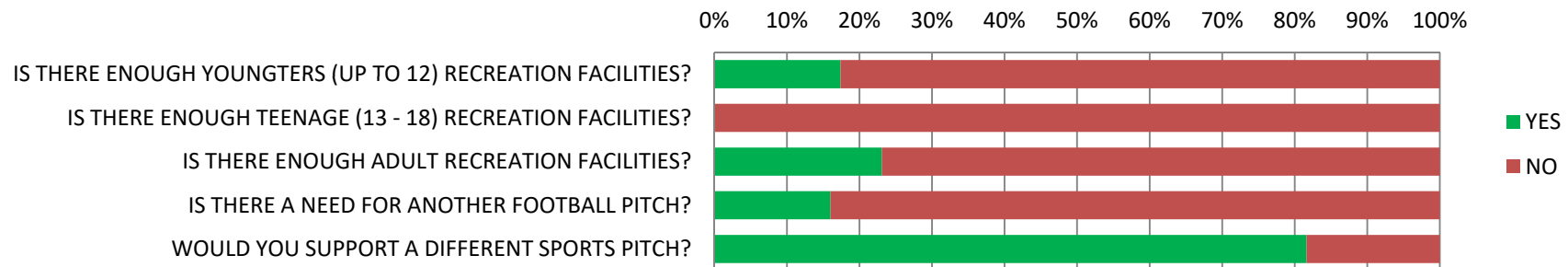
1. Village events promote a 'community spirit' and the majority of the community would like more
