Brize Norton is currently preparing a Neighbourhood Plan. As part of its evidence gathering process, the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group commissioned Community First Oxfordshire (CFO) to conduct a young person's questionnaire survey in September 2017. CFO is a charity that works with and supports communities across the county and has long-standing expertise in helping communities with consultation strategies.

The survey gave all young people in the parish the opportunity to express an opinion on various community issues. This was via an online survey

The survey had 23 questions covering 9 sections

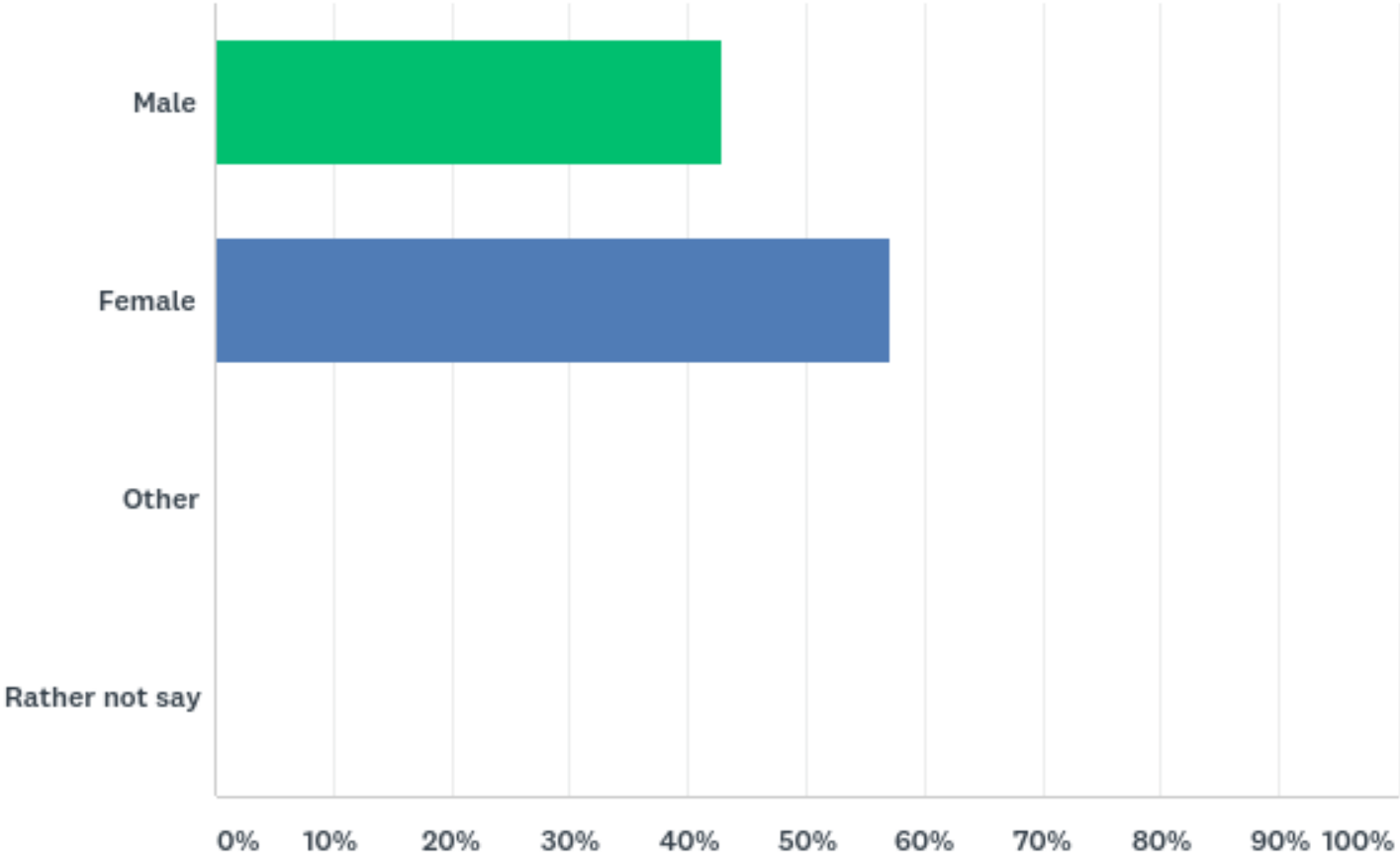

DISTRIBUTION AND RESPONSE

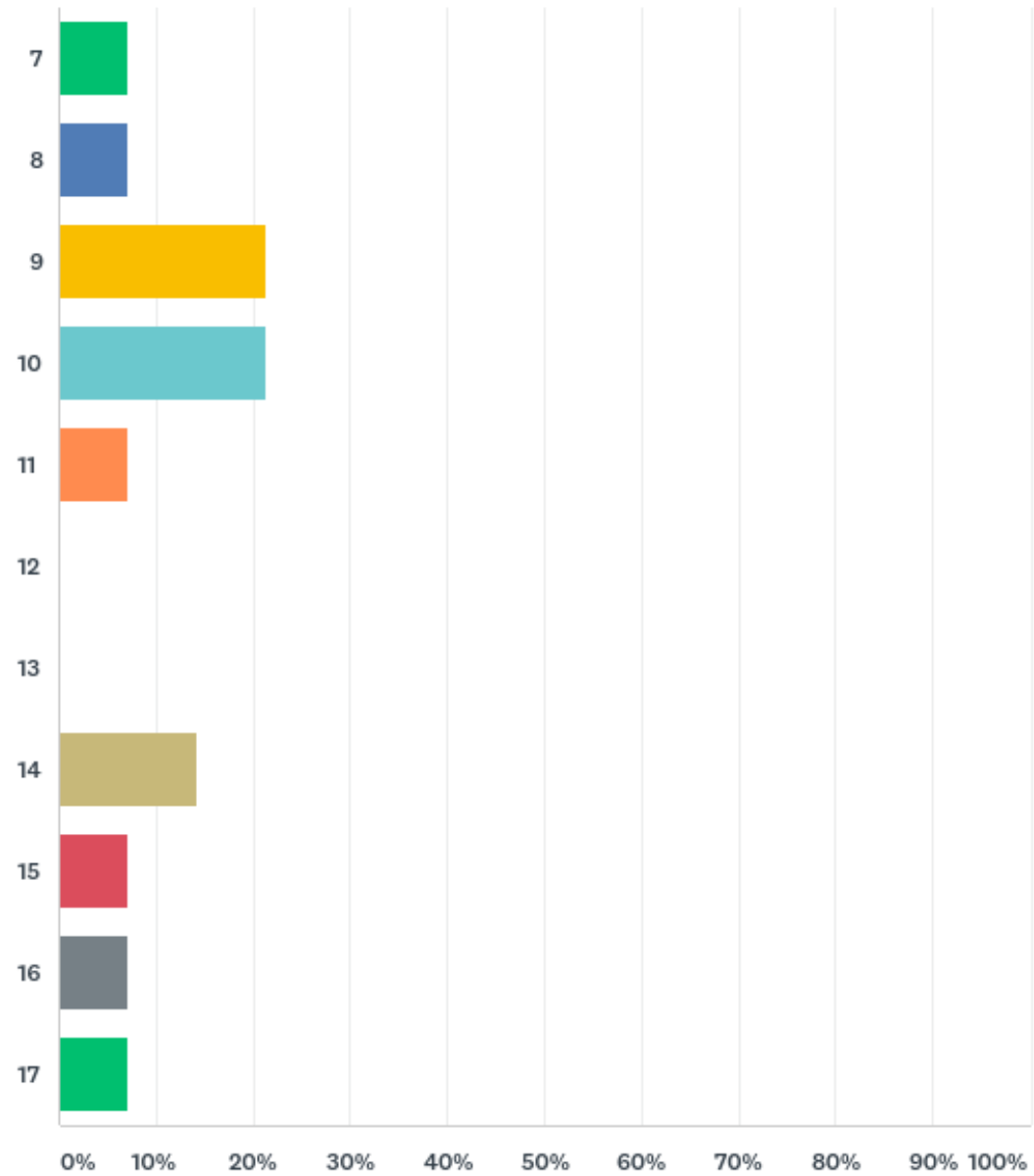
- NPSG supplied the content for the survey

No information is known about the non-respondents, and no assumptions have been made about their opinions.

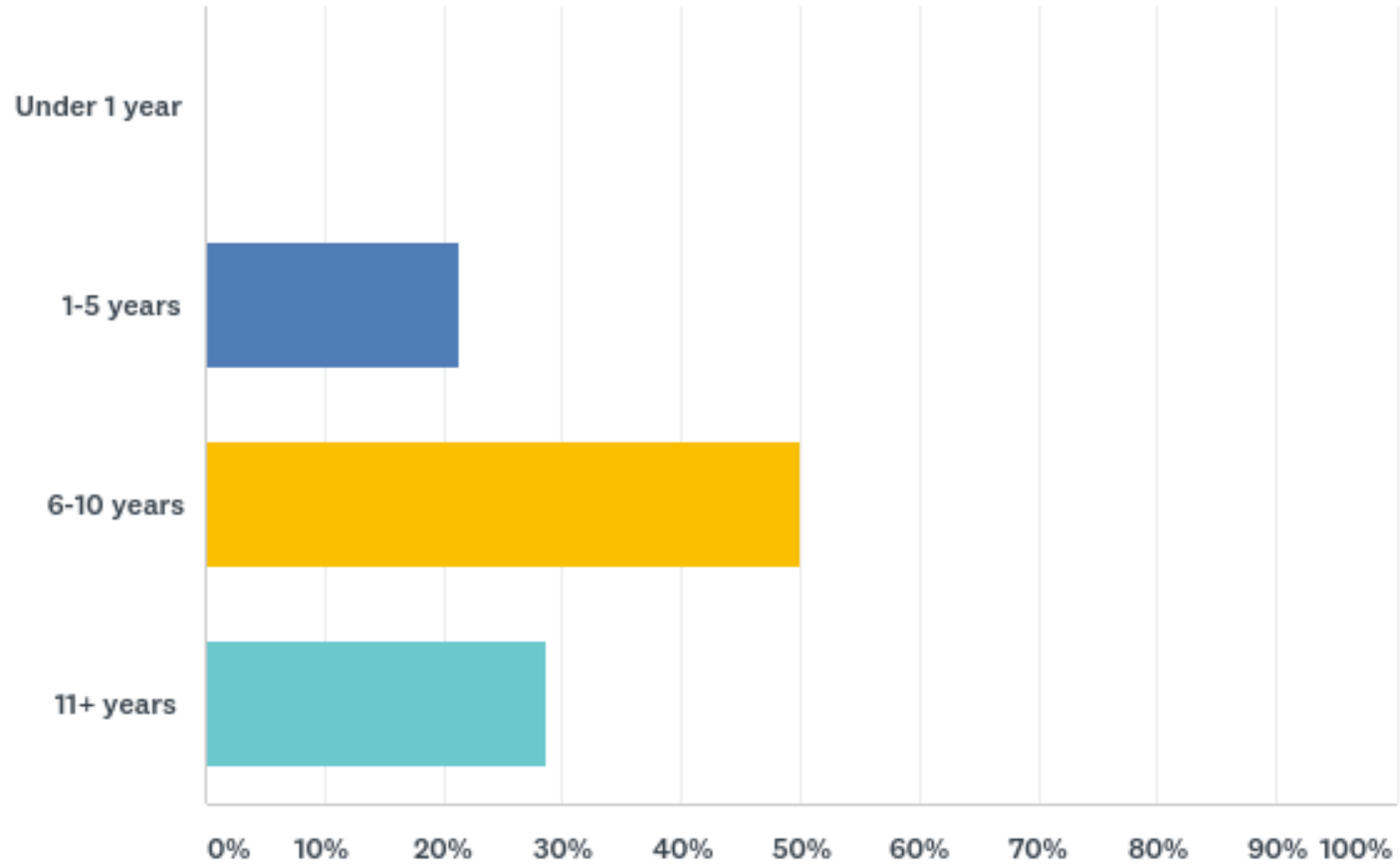

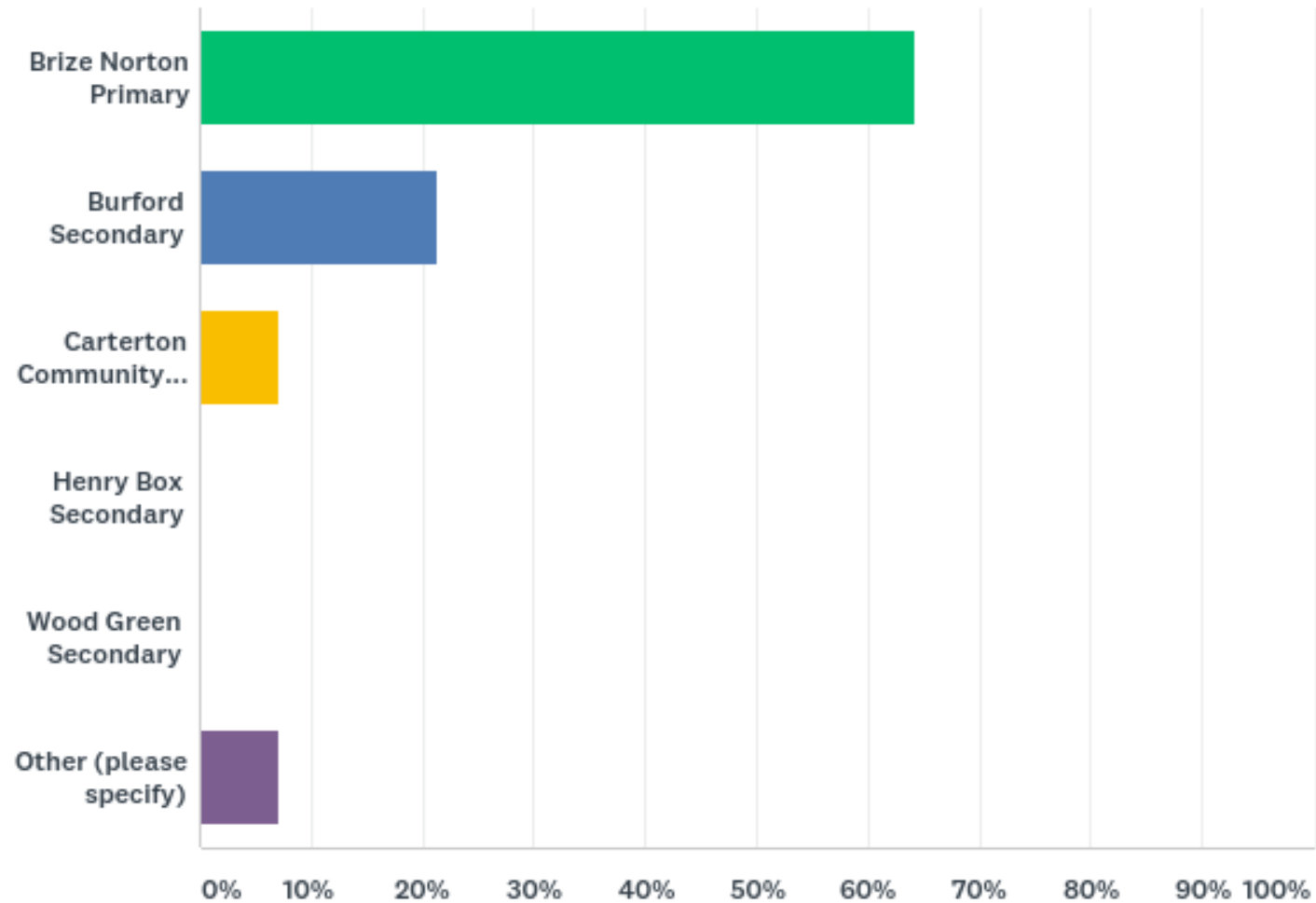
Q2 How old are you?



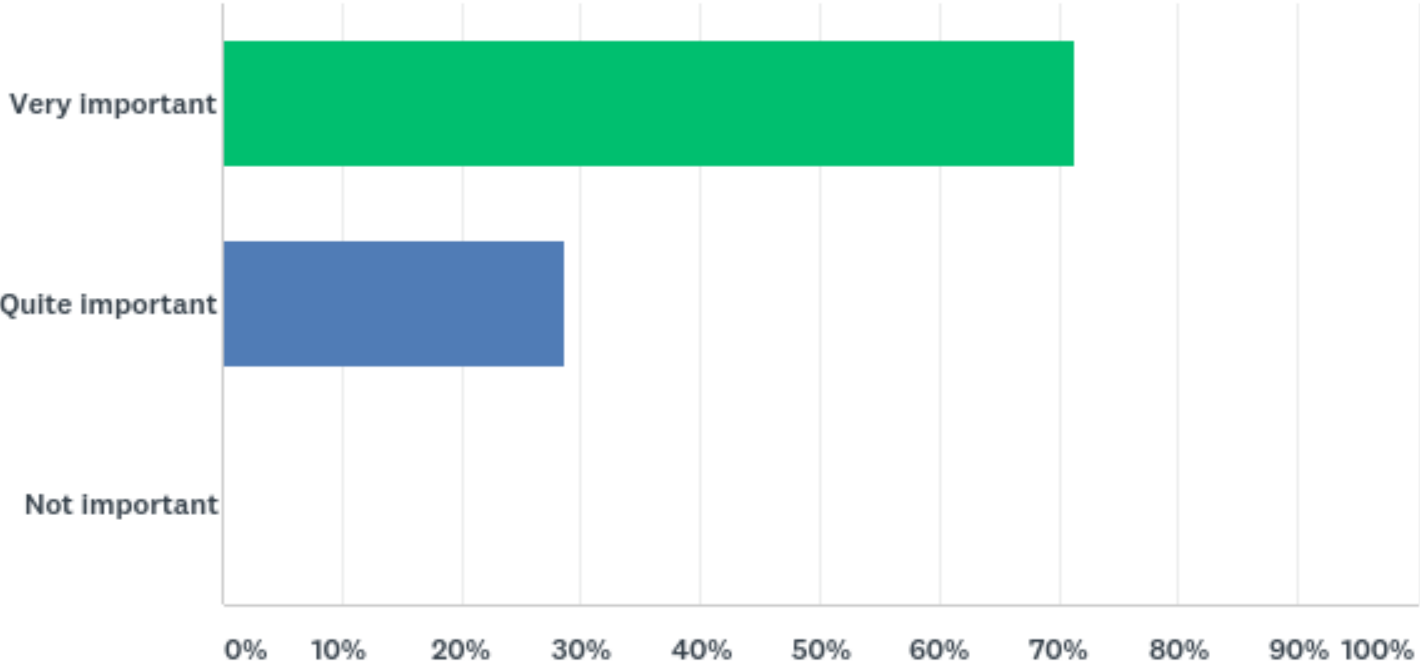
Q3 How long have you lived in the village?



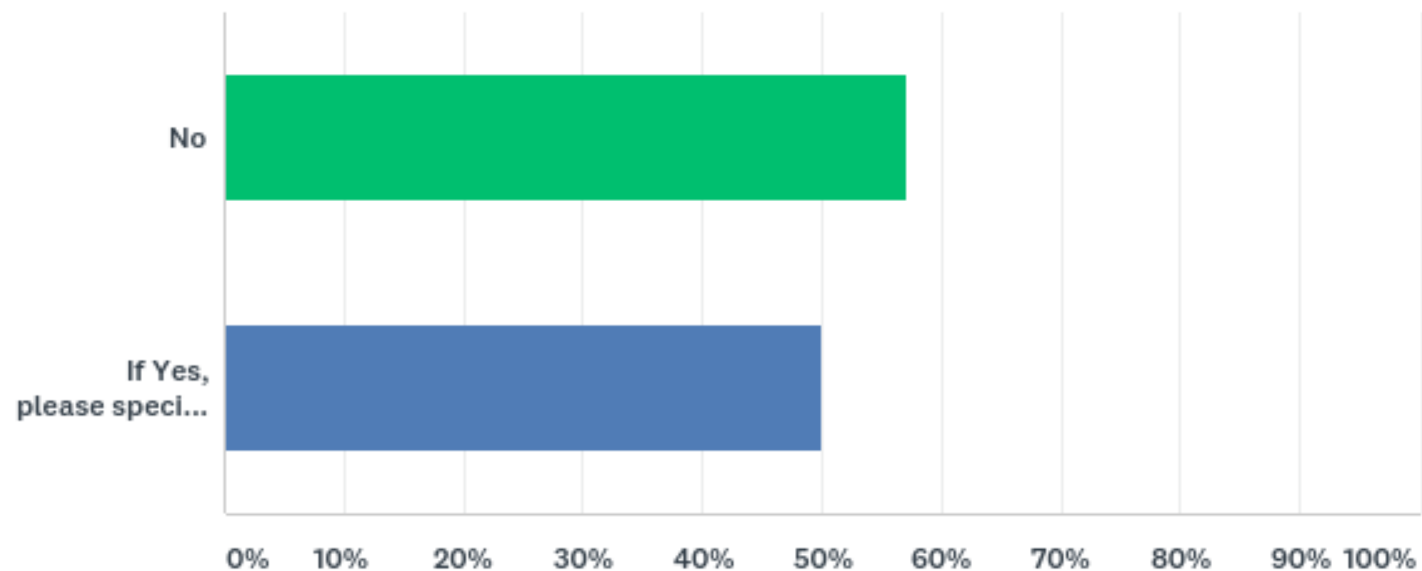
Q4 Which school do you currently attend?



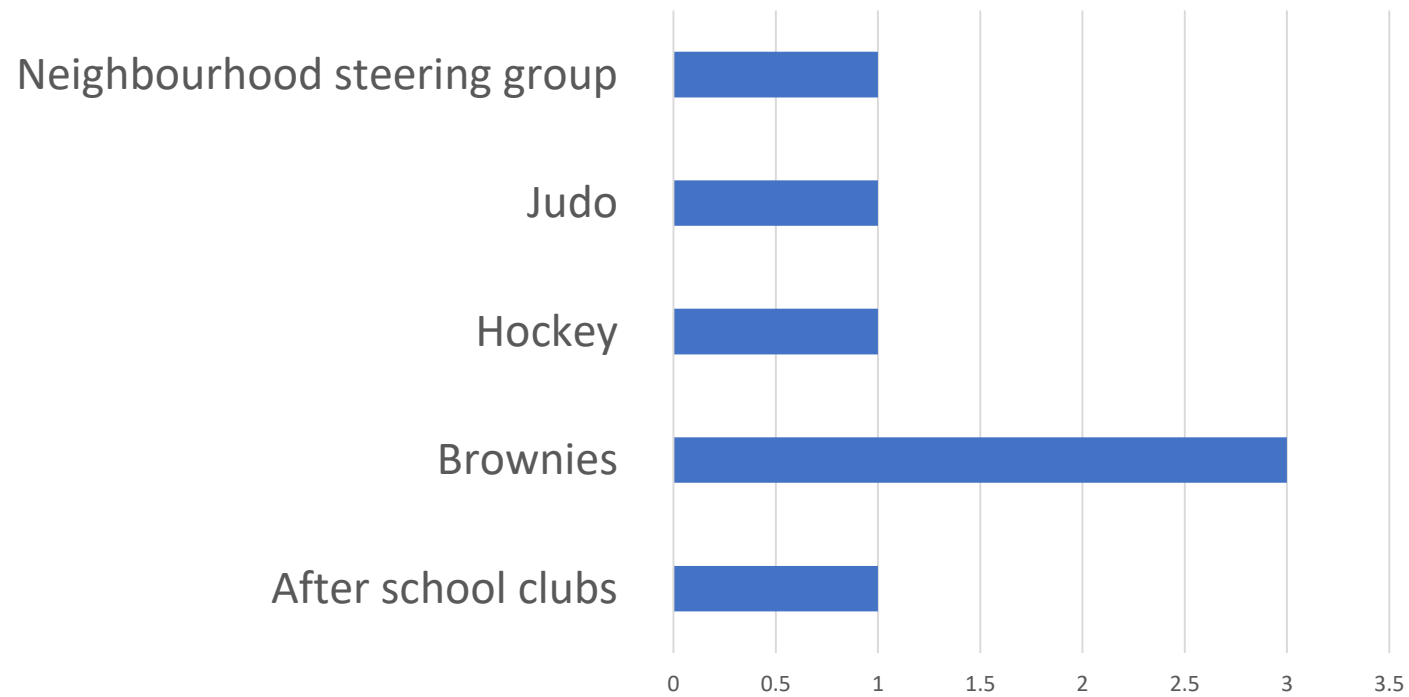
Q5 How important is it that Brize Norton Primary School has places available for the children of Brize Norton?



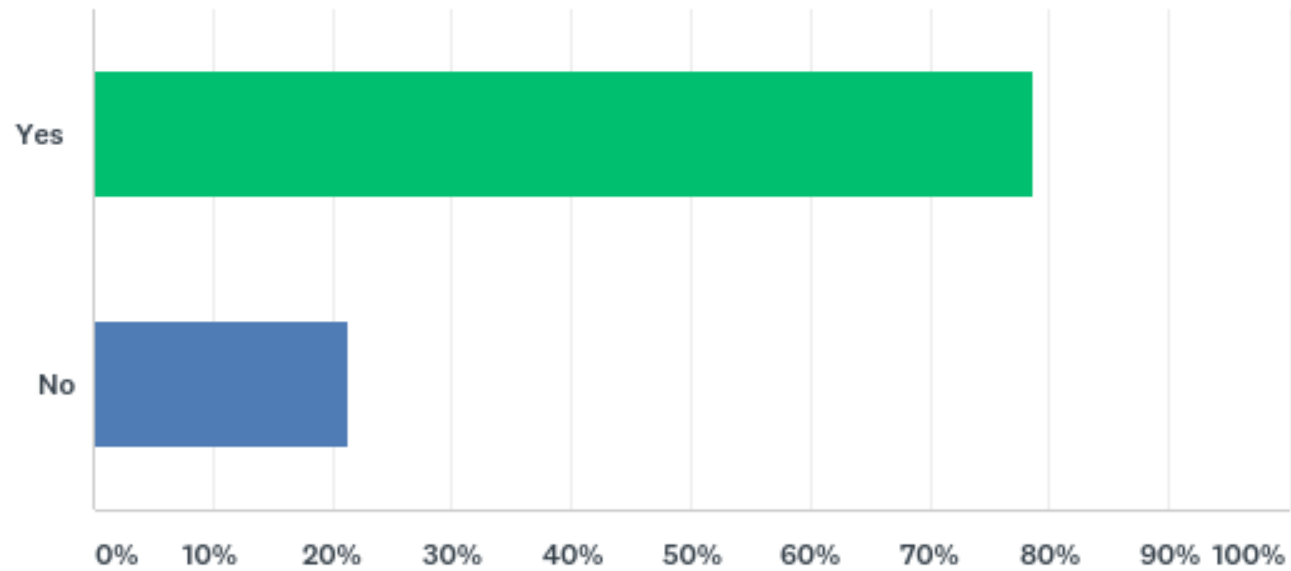
Q6 Are you involved in any clubs or activities inside the village?



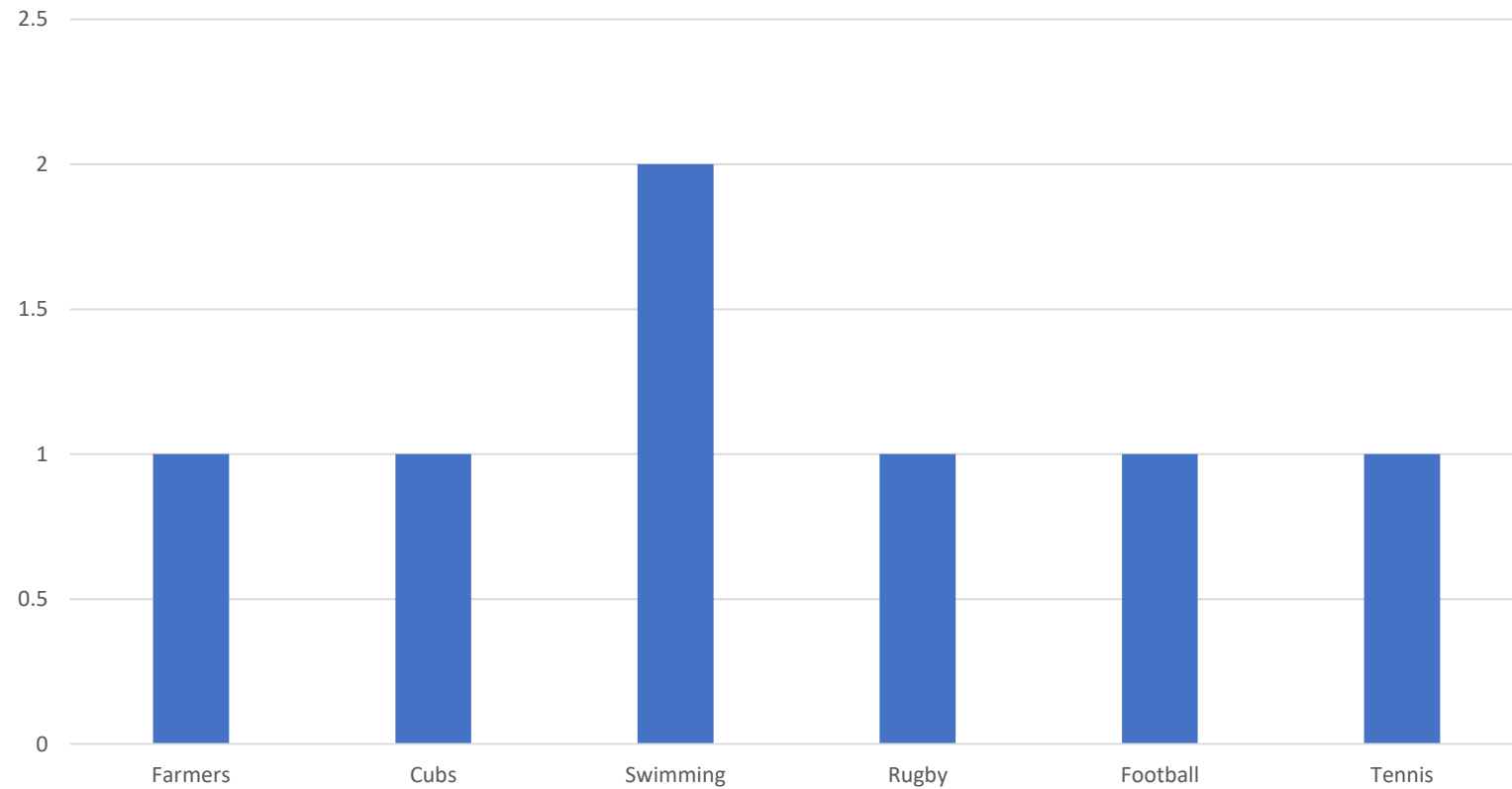
Q6 What clubs /activity do you do in the village? Responses



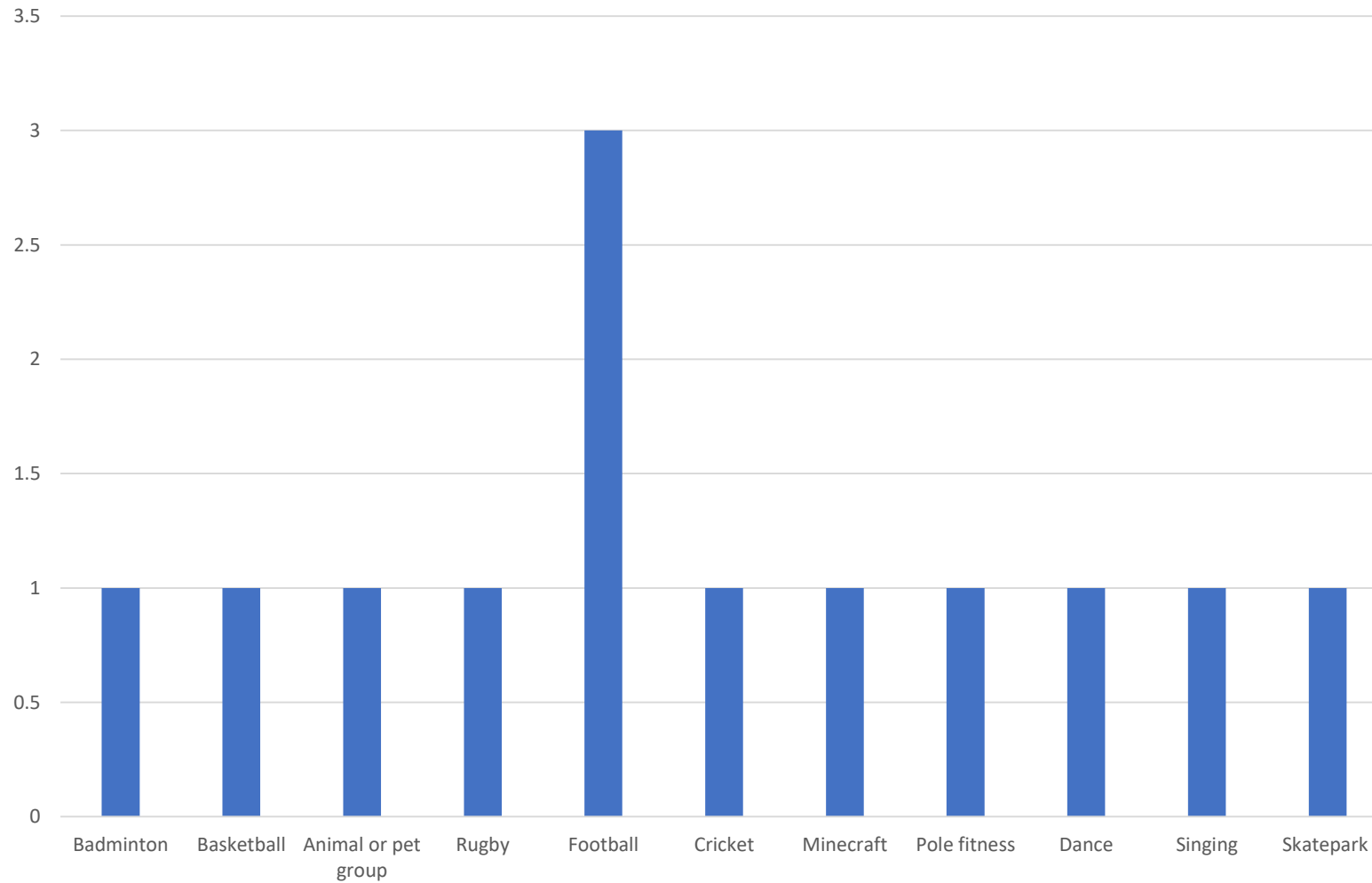
Q7 Are you involved in any clubs or activities outside the village?



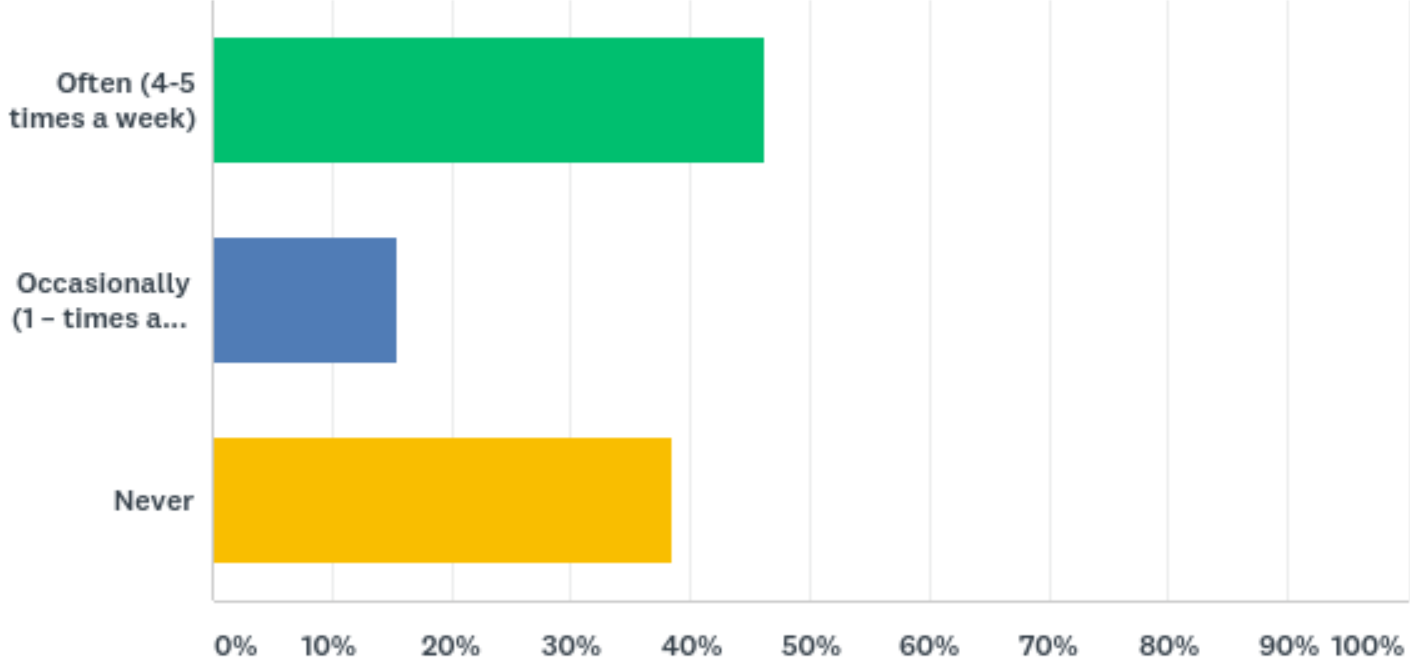
Q7 What clubs /activities are you involved with outside the village? Responses



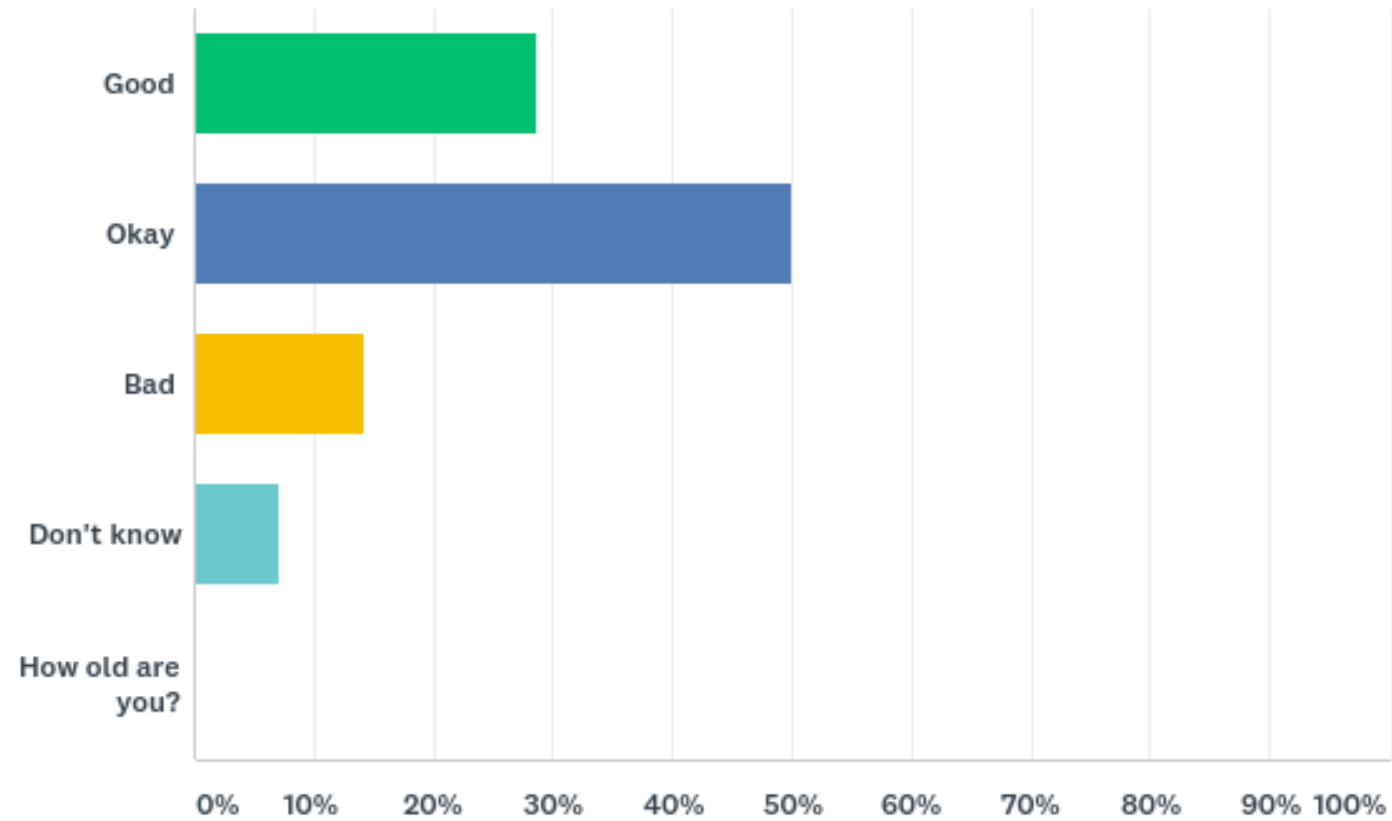
Q8 What clubs or activities would you like to see in the village?



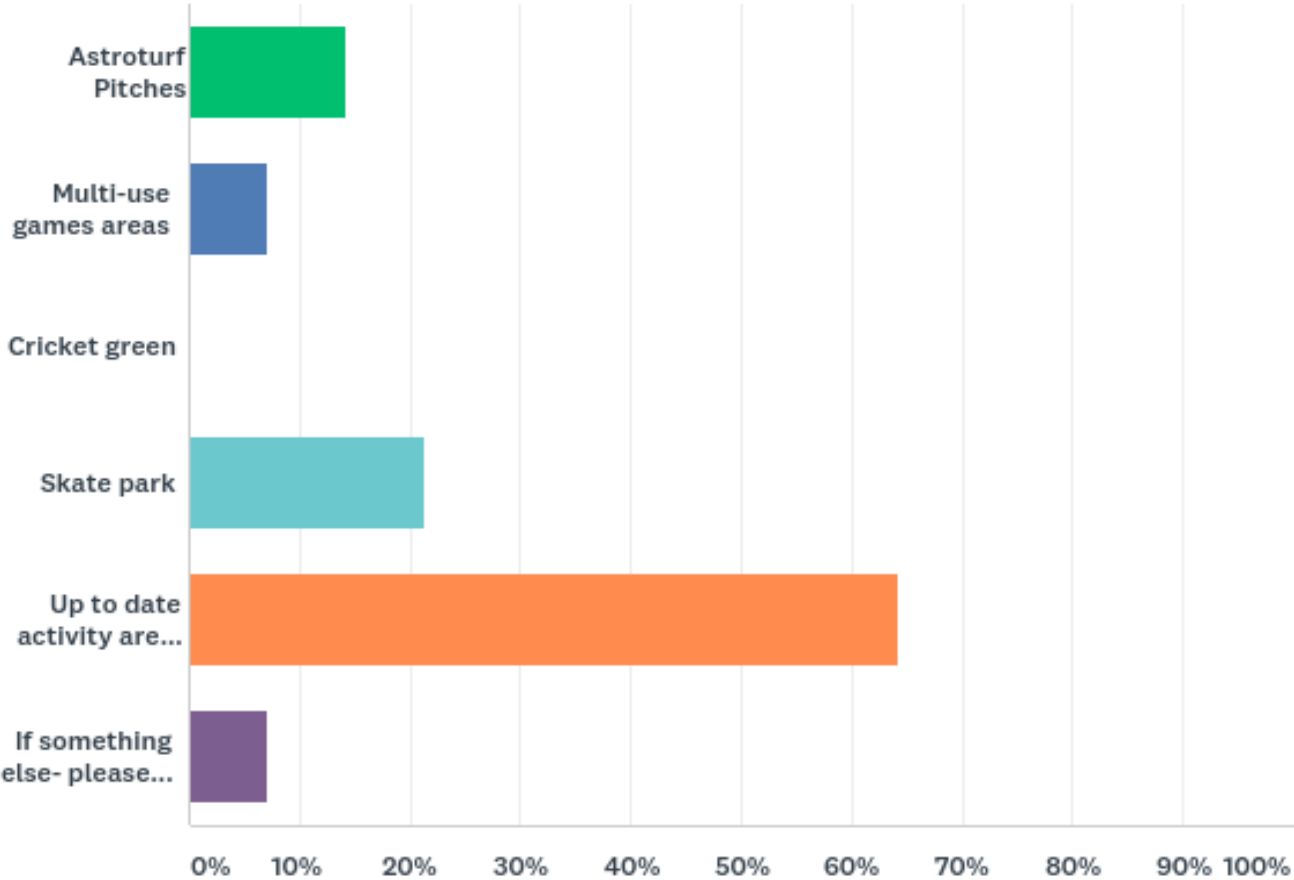
Q9 How often do you use the playground next to the recreation ground?



Q10 How good are the recreation facilities in Brize Norton for your age group?

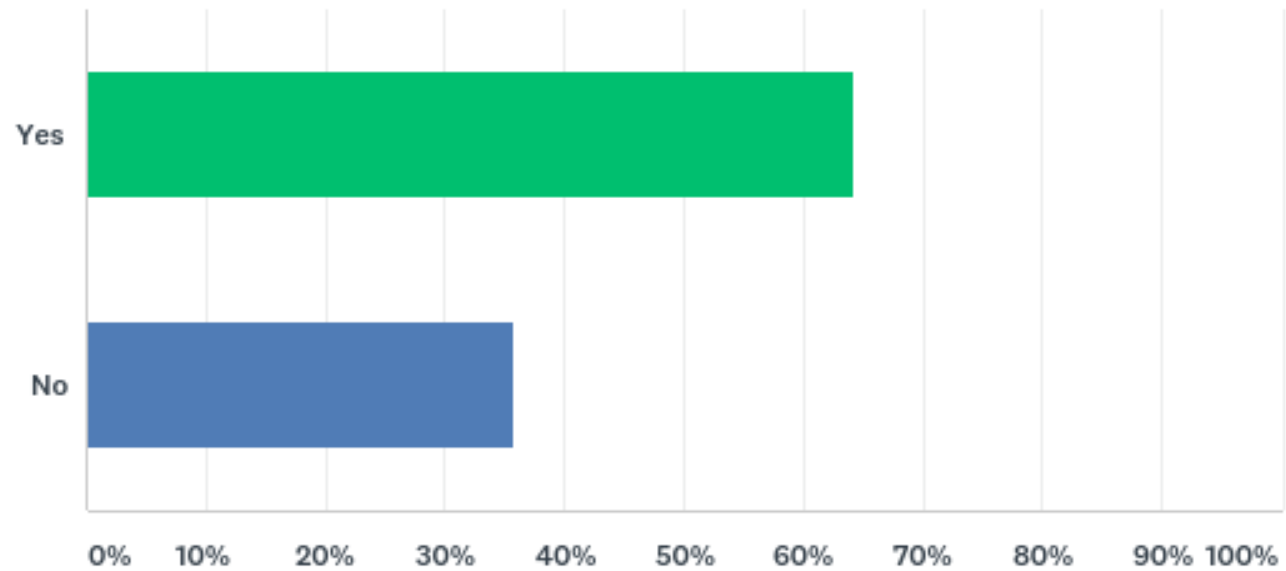


Q11 If Brize Norton receives money to improve sports facilities, what do you think it should be spent it on?

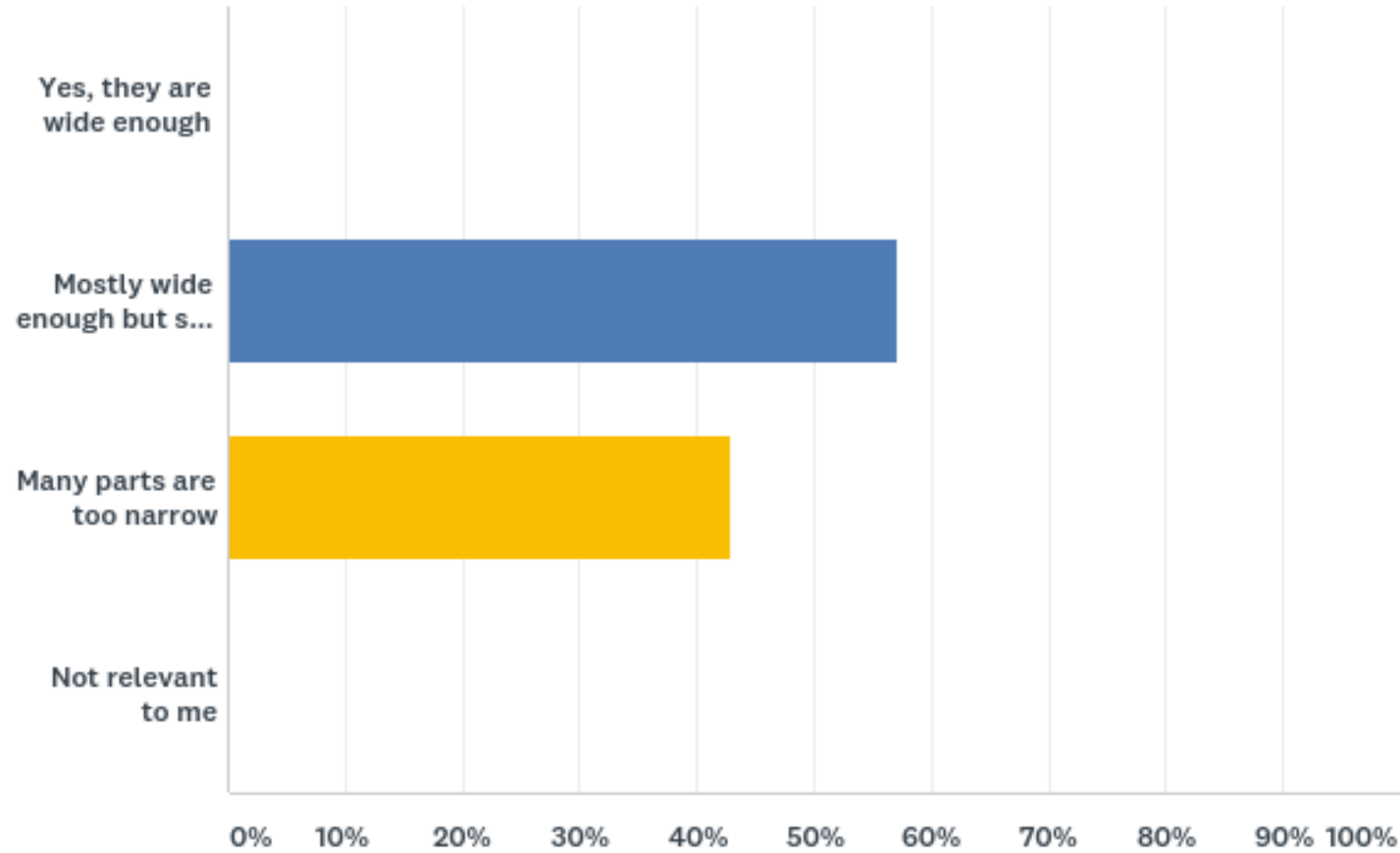

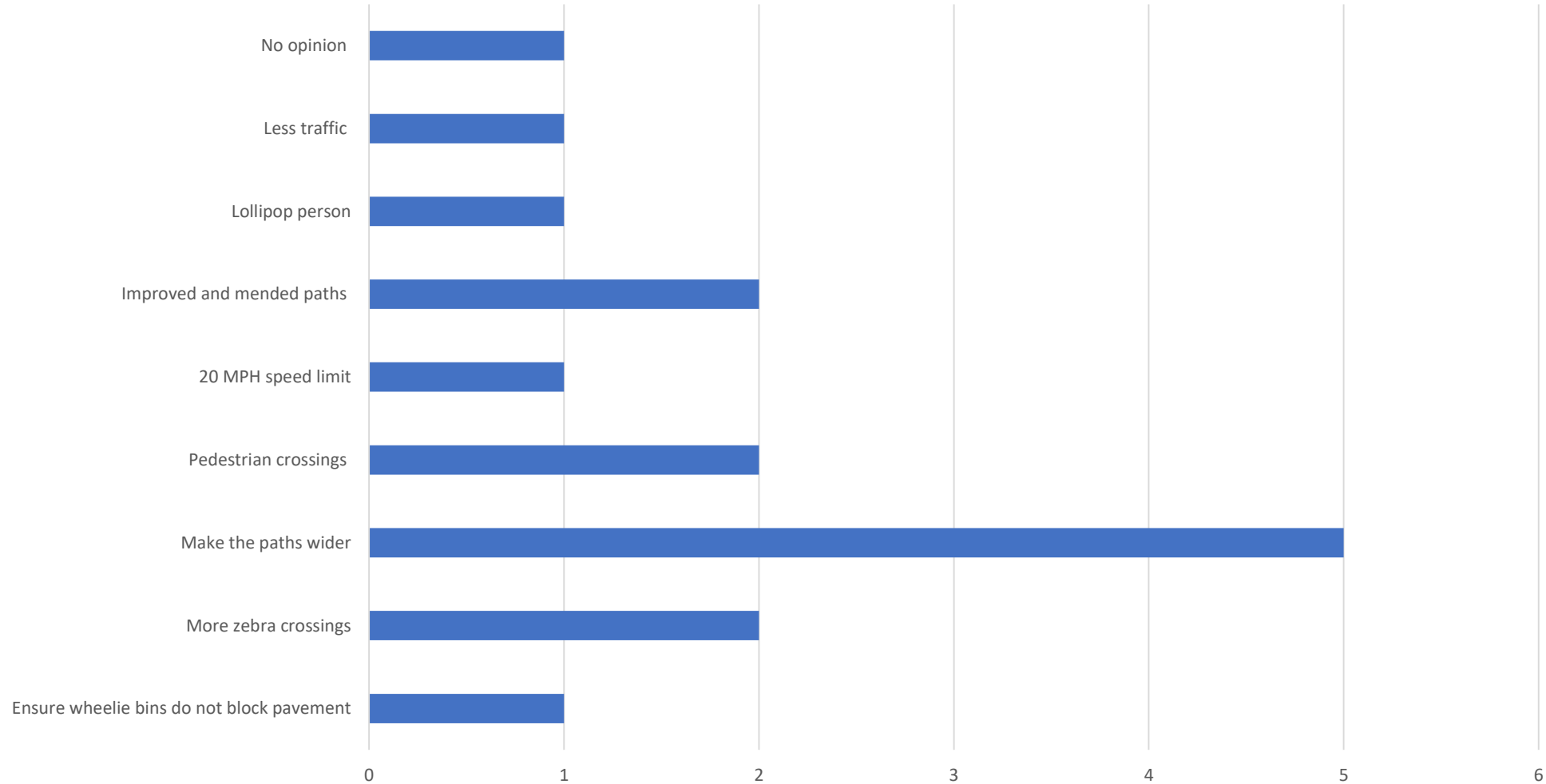
Q12 Do you feel safe walking in the village?



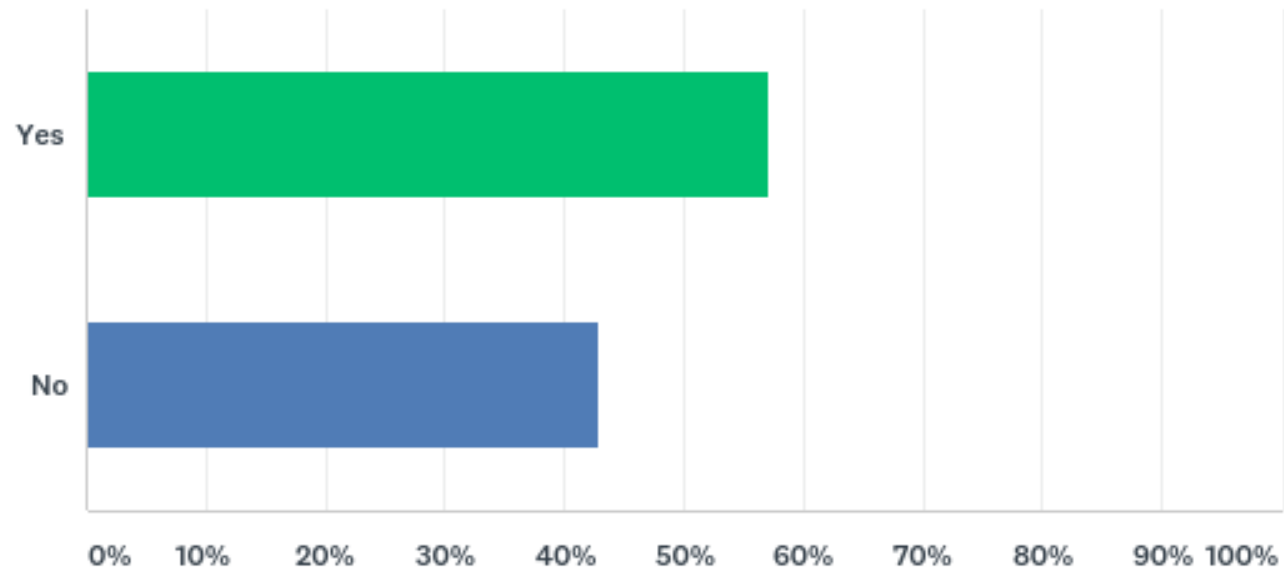
Q13 Are the pavements in Brize Norton wide enough to safely walk to school or to the school bus?



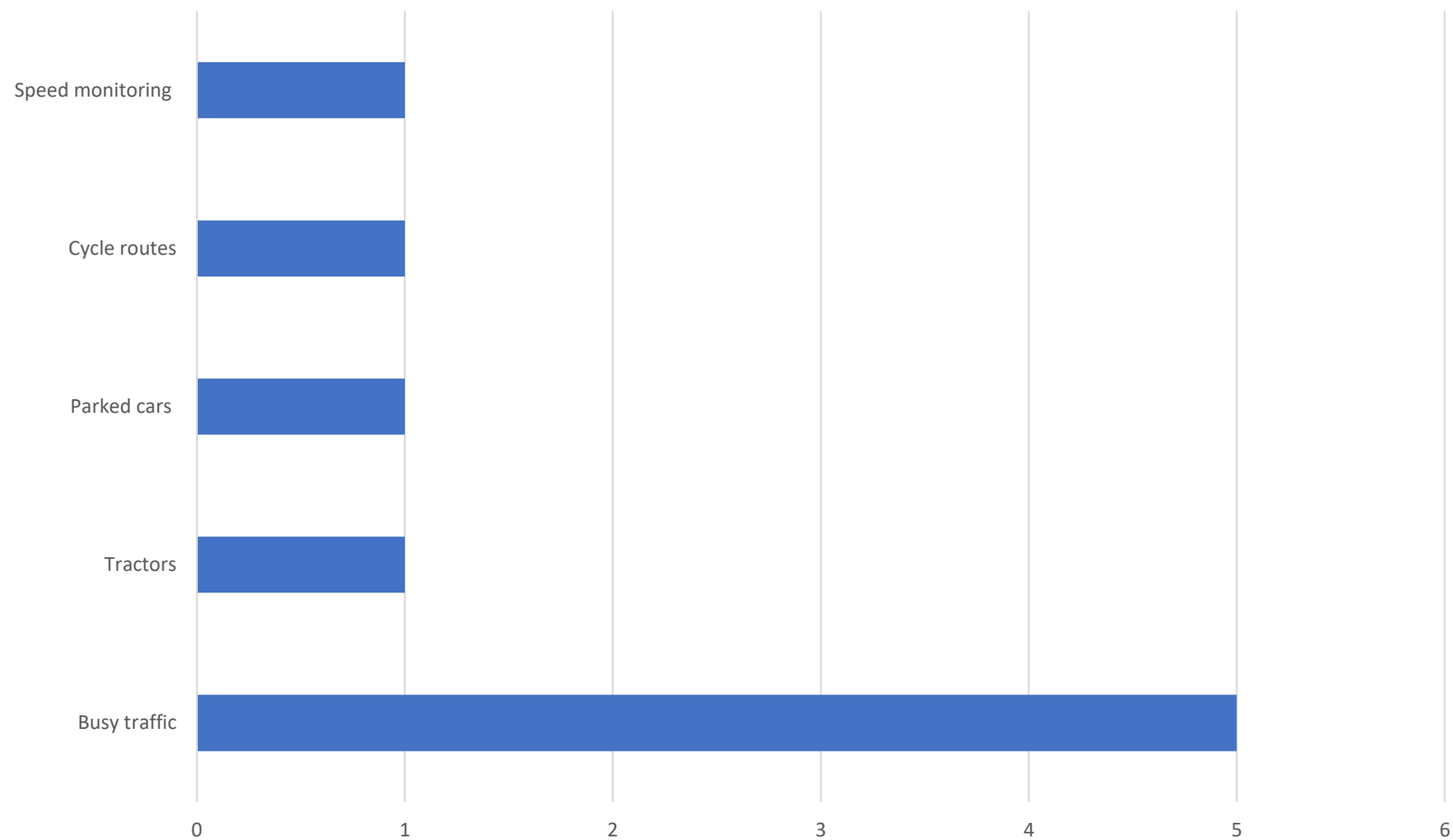
Q14 What do you think would make walking in the village safer?



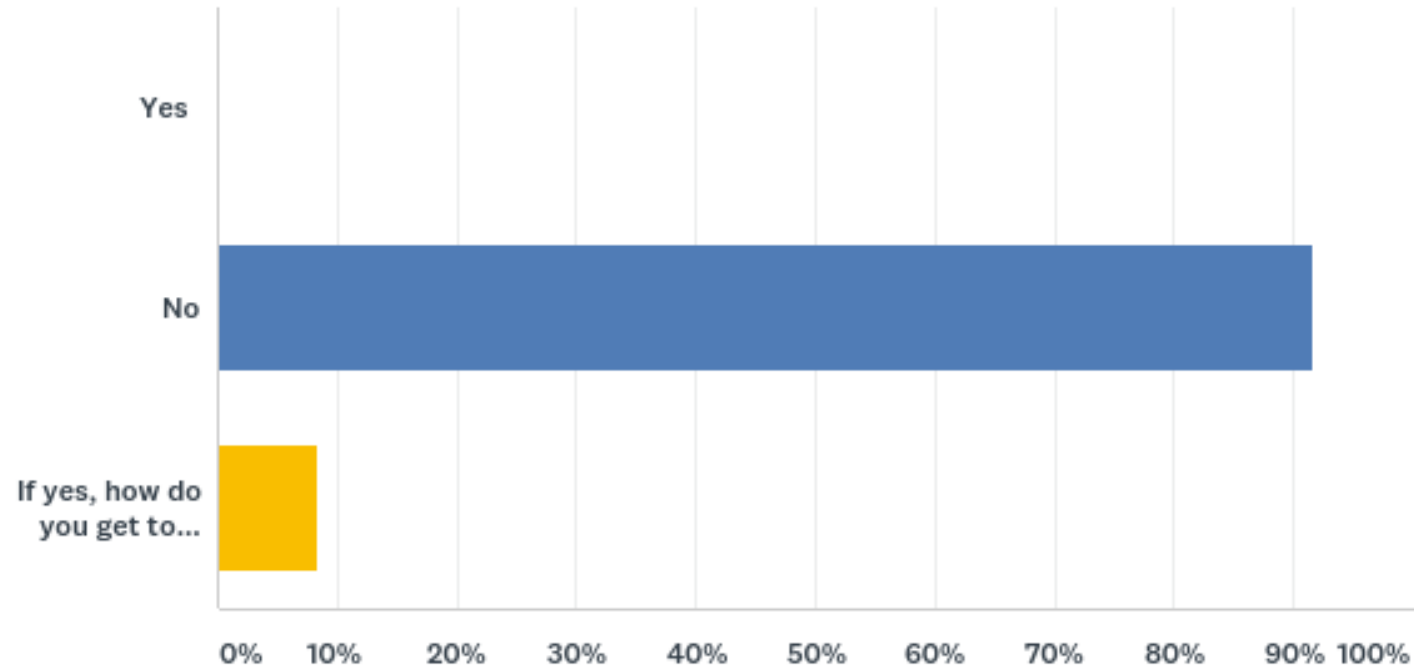
Q15 Do you feel safe cycling in the village?



Q15 Do you feel safe cycling in the village – responses

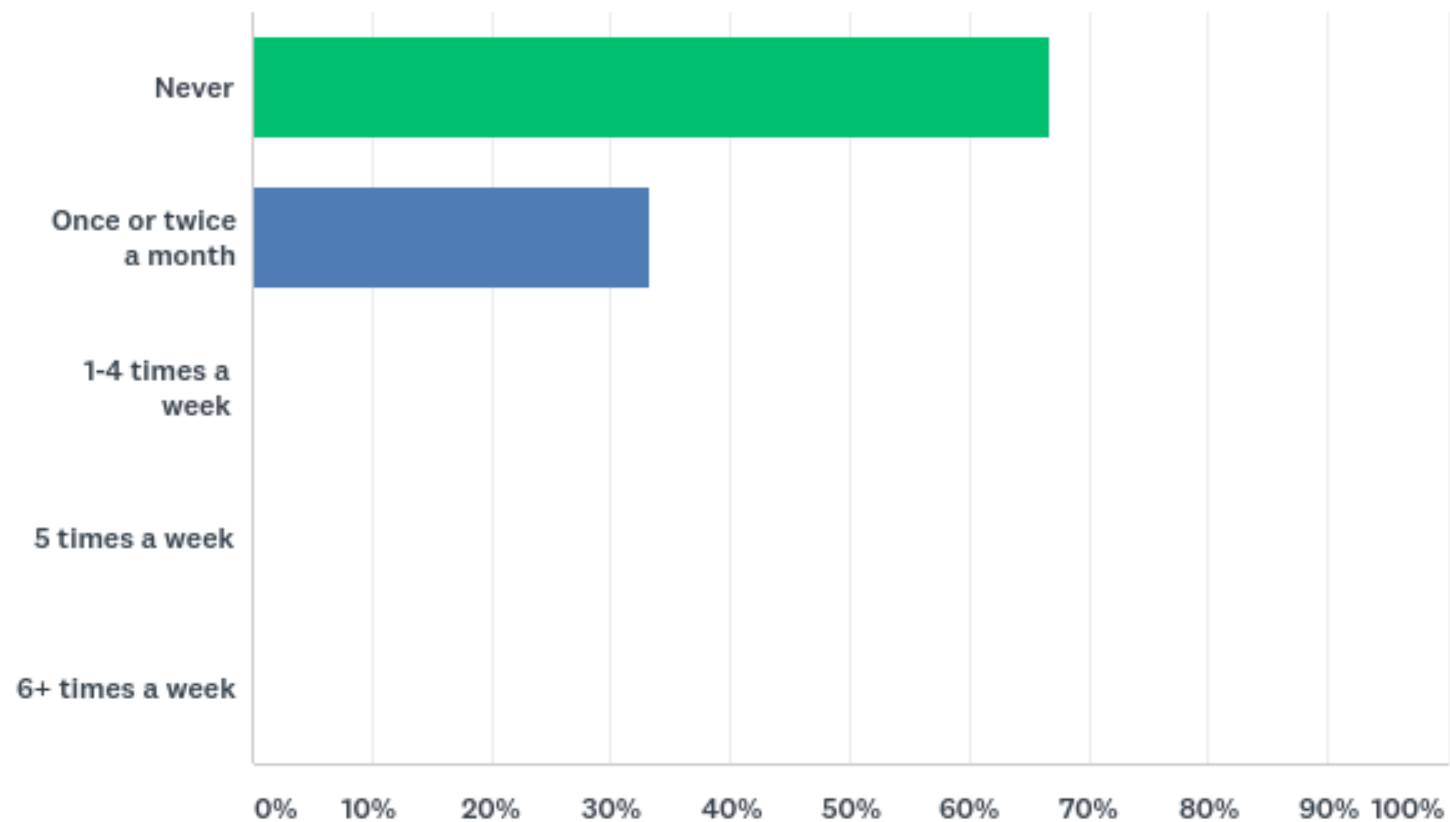


Q16 Do you have a job outside the village? (only answer if you are aged 13 to 17)

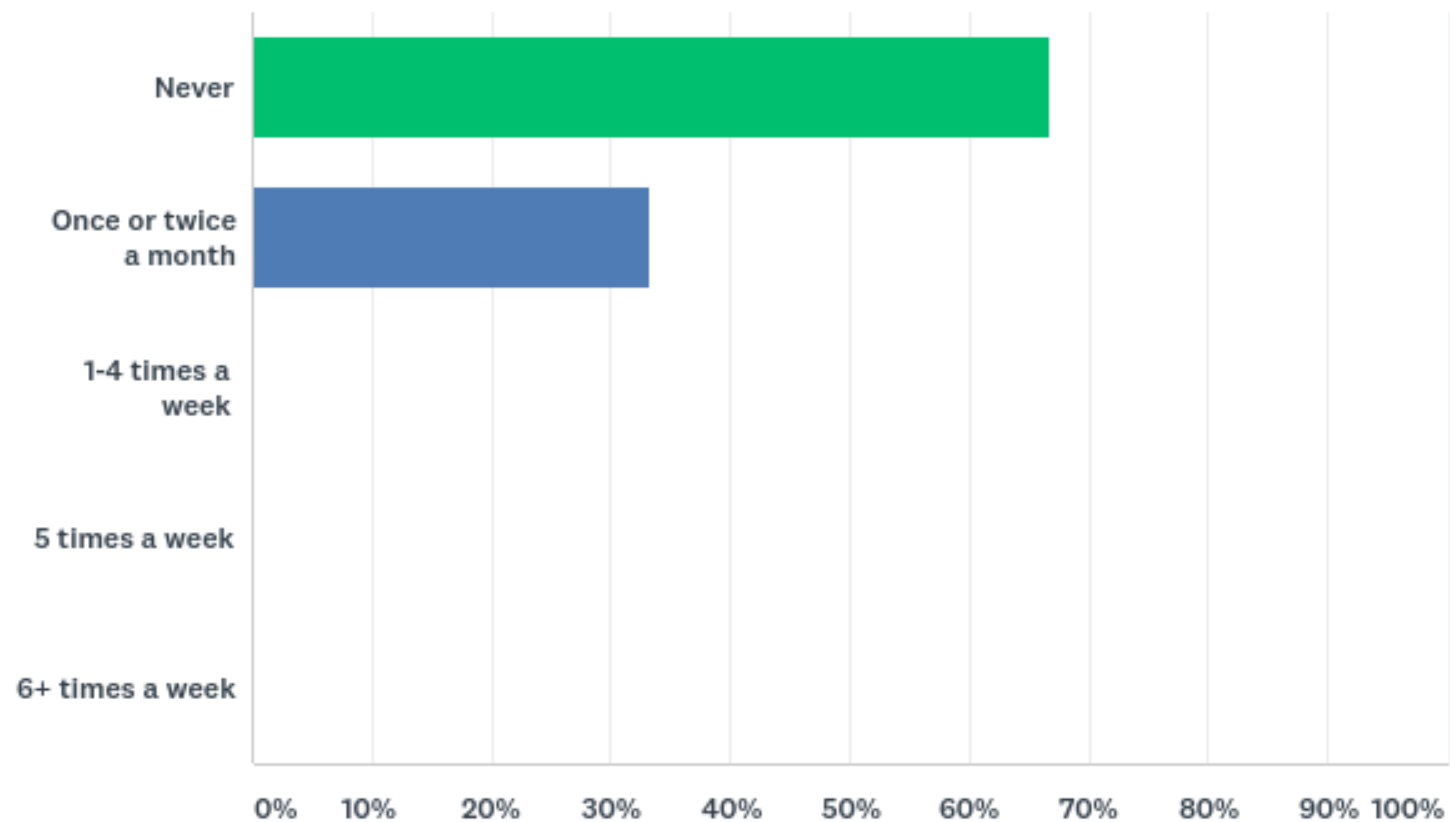

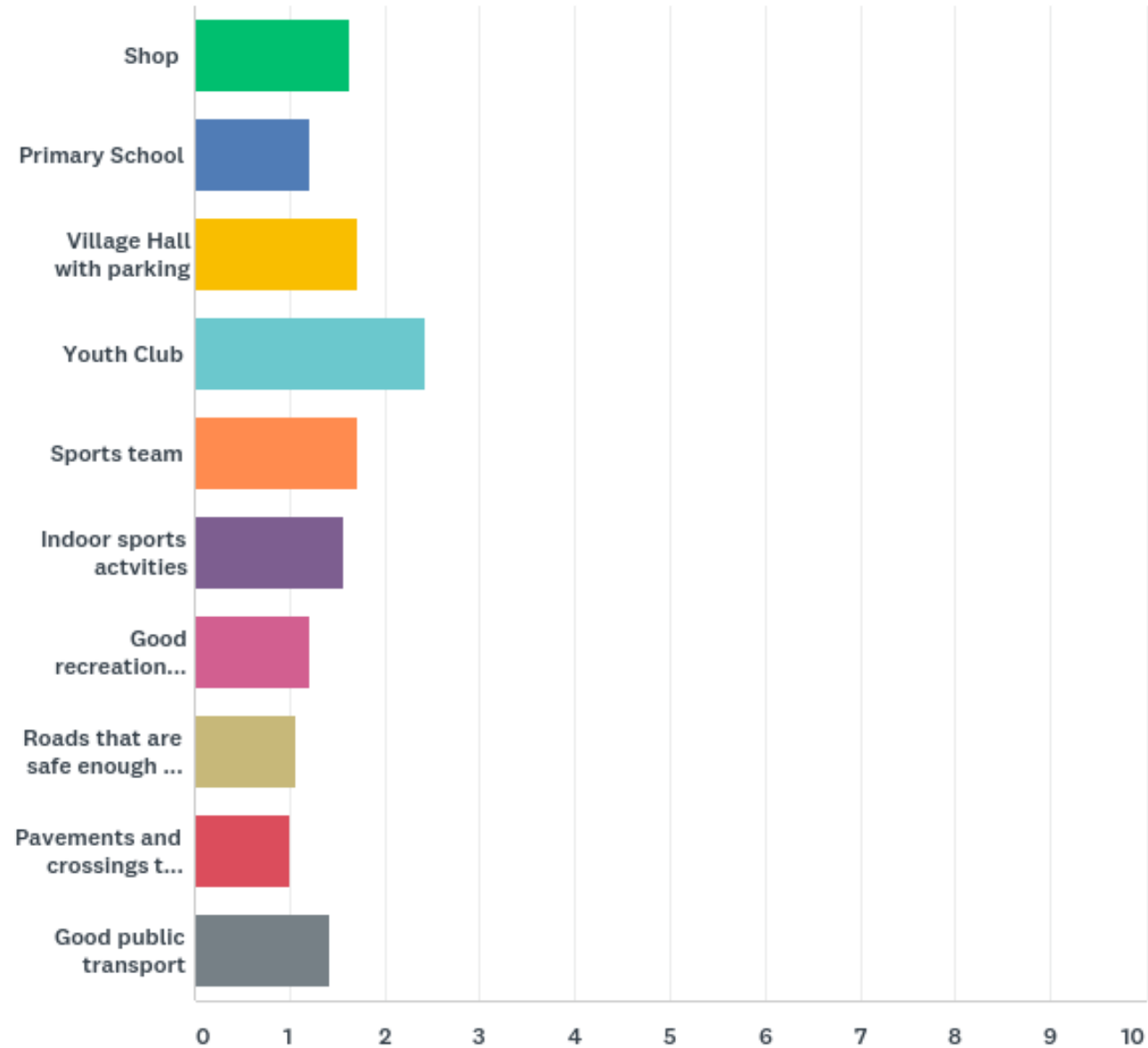
Q17 How often do you use the village bus services? (only answer if you are aged 13 to 17)



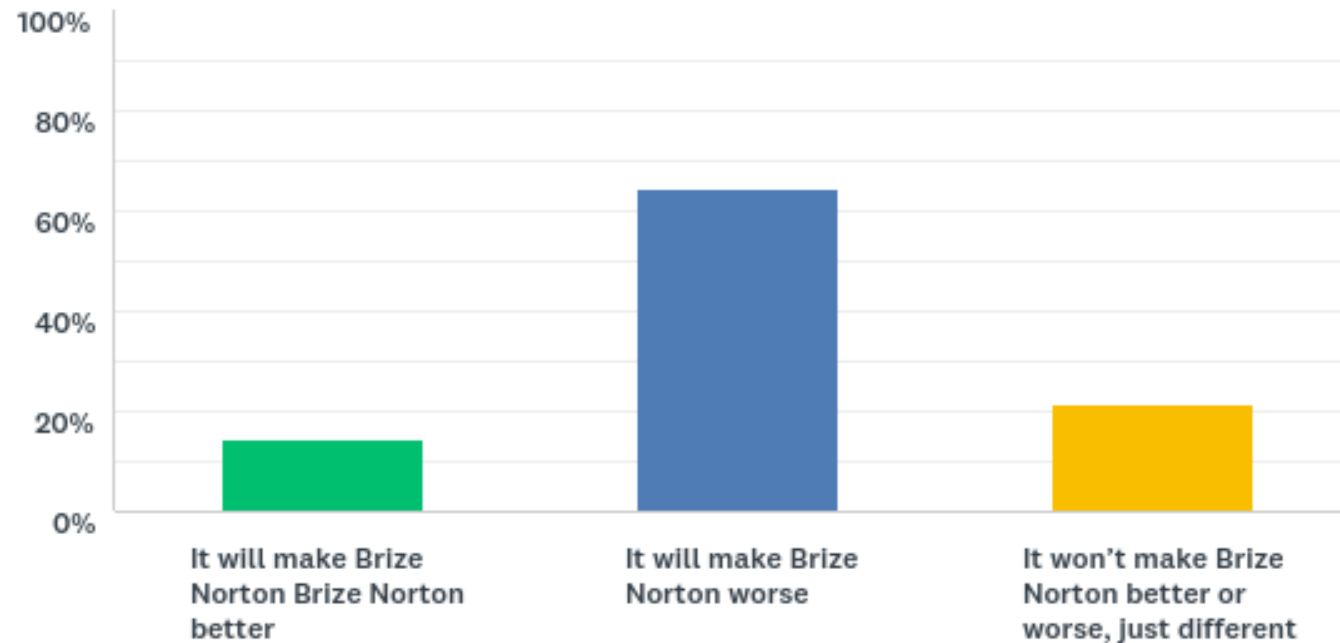

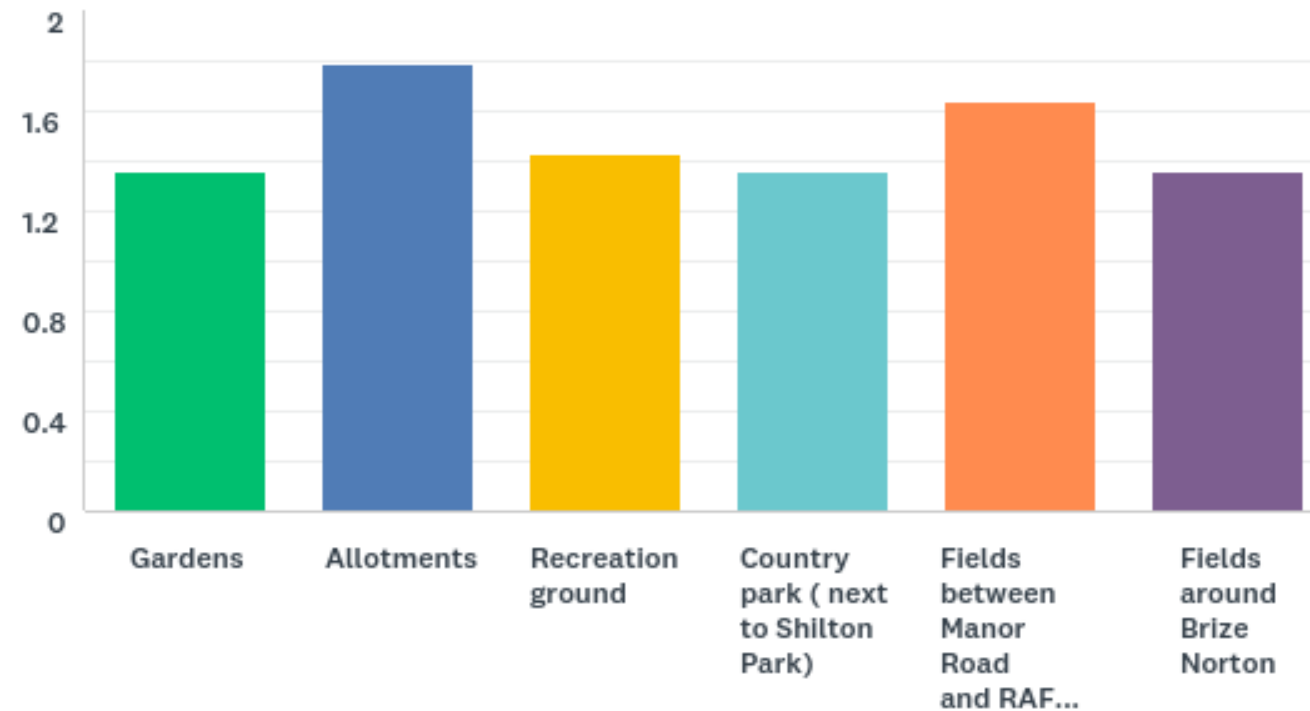

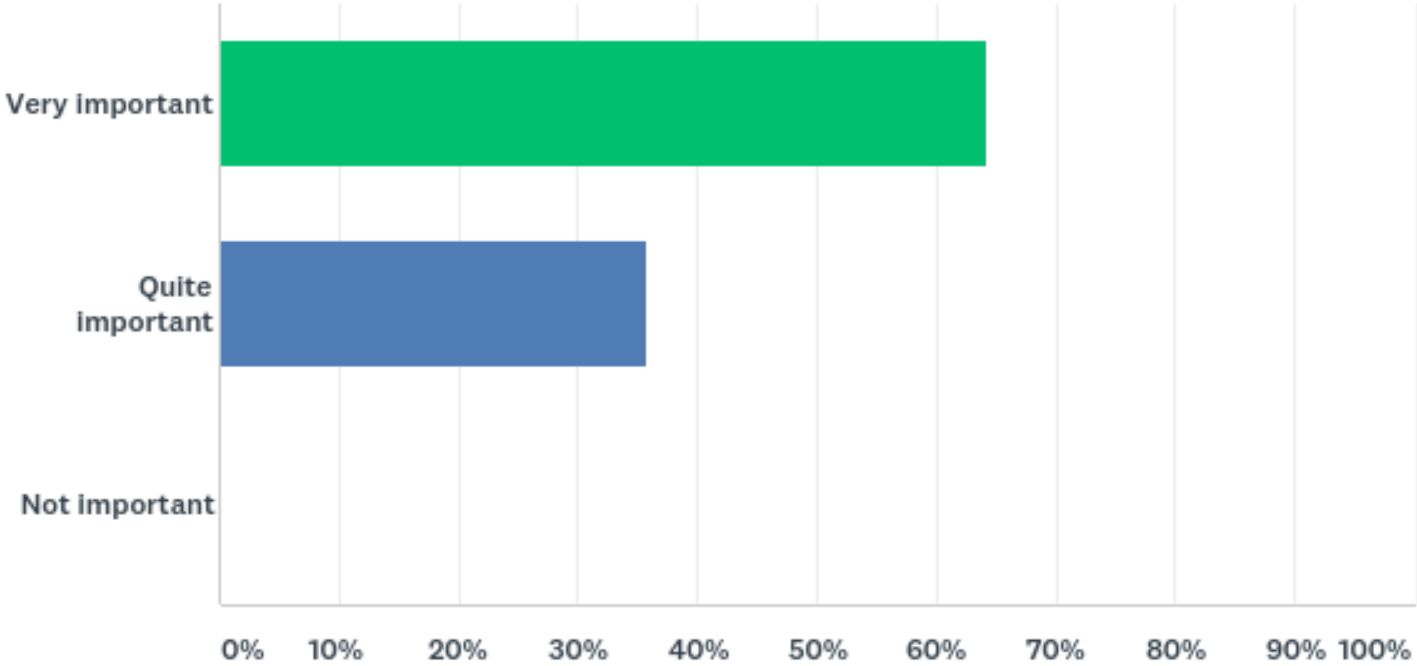
Q19 Brize Norton will have another 700 houses built over the next 9 years. (our 2011 population was under 1000 but this will grow to 2,500+) What do you think about this?



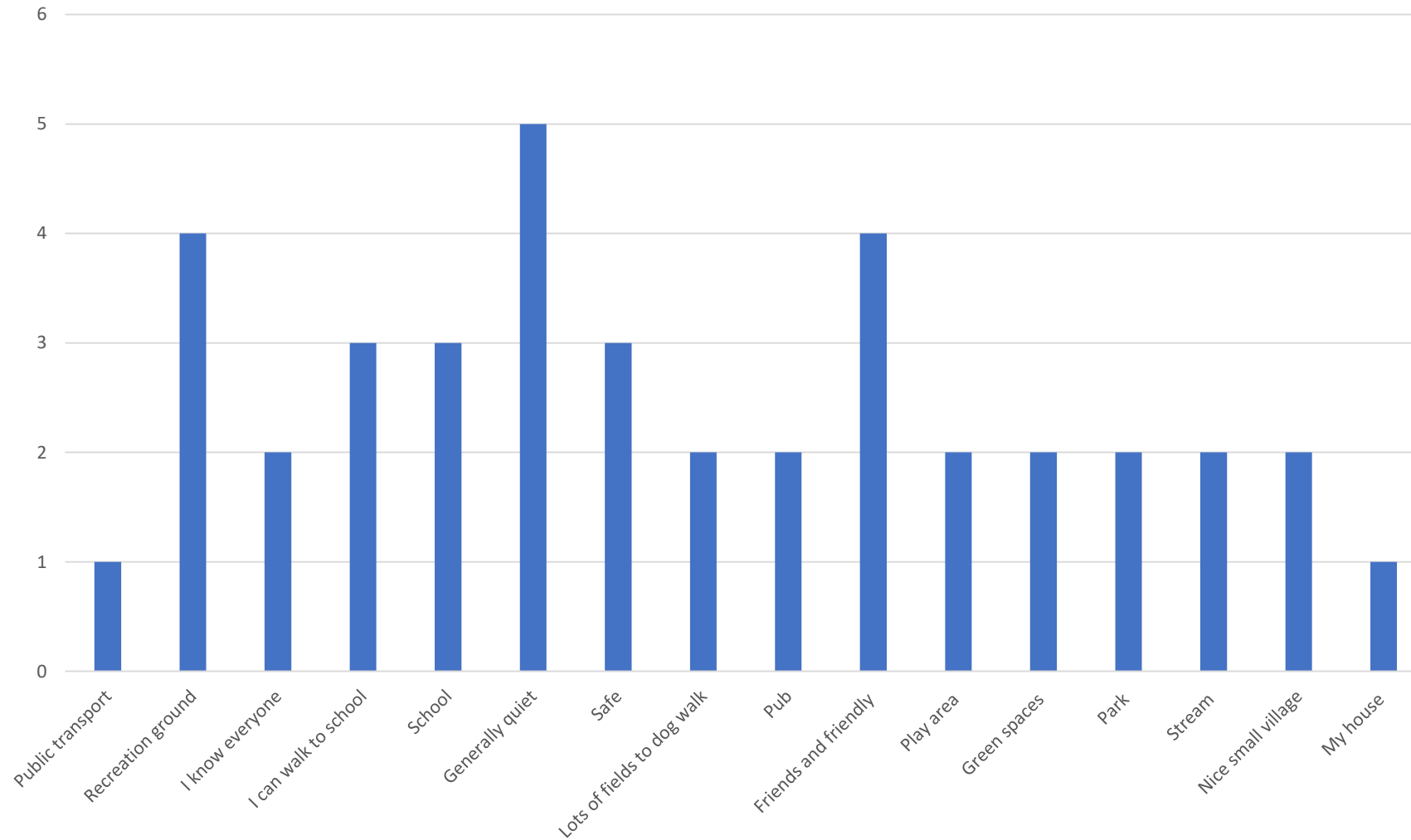
Q20 How important are the green spaces in and around Brize Norton?



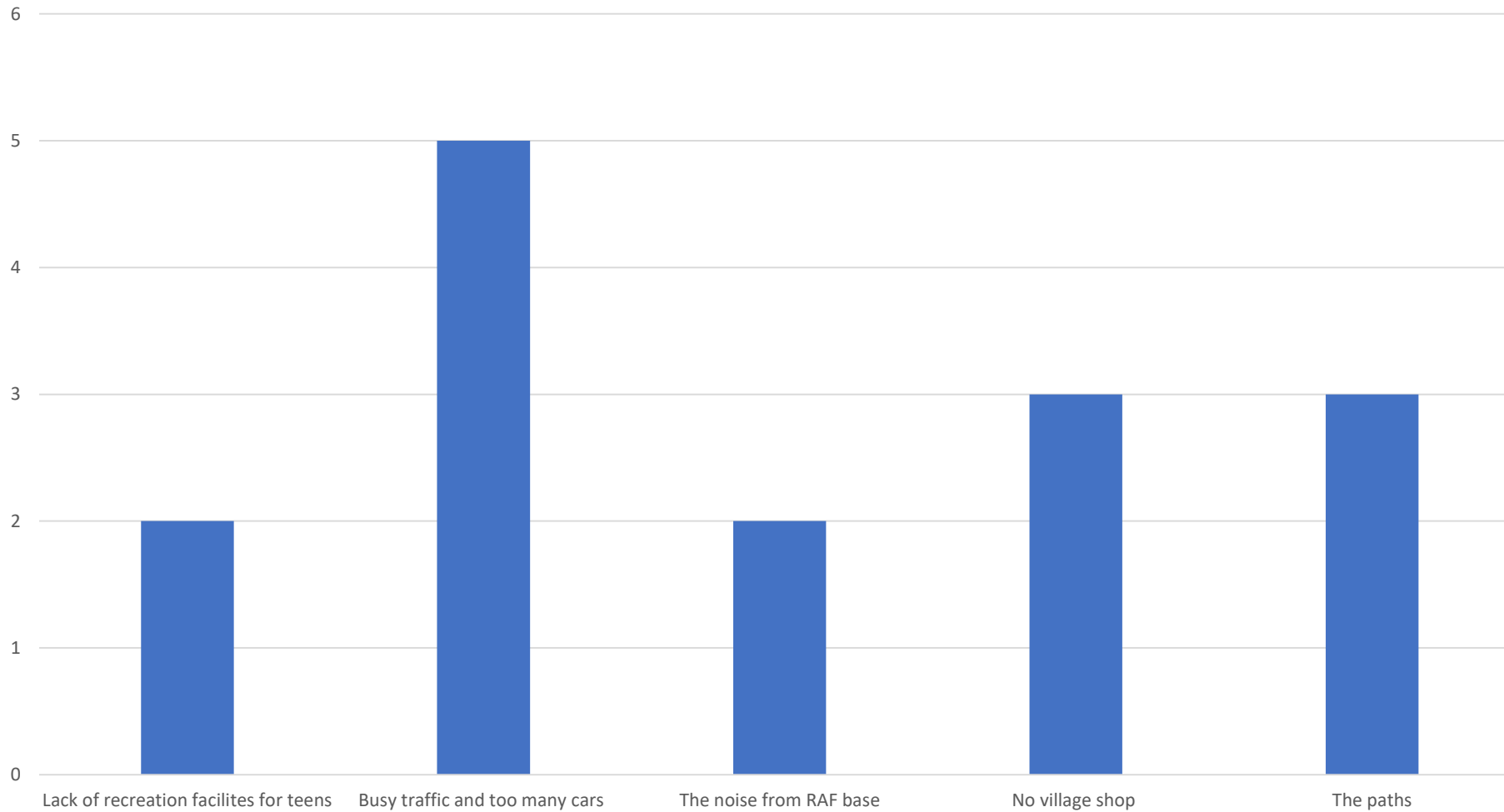
Q21 How important is it that we should do more to encourage wildlife, natural plants and flowers?
