COMMUNITY QUESTIONNAIRE REPORT

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INTRODUCTION AND RATIONALE

Brize Norton is currently preparing a Neighbourhood Plan. As part of its evidence gathering process, the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group commissioned Community First Oxfordshire (CFO) to conduct a community questionnaire survey in September 2017. CFO is a charity that works with and supports communities across the county and has long-standing expertise in helping communities with consultation strategies.

The survey gave all households in the parish the opportunity to express an opinion on various community issues.

The survey had eight sections.

All households were asked to complete *Part 1: Our Community; Part 2- Environment; Part 3- Character and Heritage; Part 4- You and Your Household; Part 5- Housing Needs; Part 6- New Housing; Part 7- Employment Land and Part 8- Transport and Movement.*

DISTRIBUTION AND RESPONSE

- Community First Oxfordshire, liaising with Brize Norton Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group (NPSG), prepared the survey content.
- The NPSG arranged distribution of surveys to 360 households in September 2017.
- 151 questionnaires were returned directly to CFO by respondents via pre-paid *Freepost* envelopes: a response rate of 42%.
- CFO analysed the returned surveys and prepared this report.
- No information is known about the non-respondents, and no assumptions have been made about their opinions.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

The report gives a detailed breakdown of answers to all survey questions. The following is a selection of findings.

PART 1 - Our Community

Top three village facilities used DAILY, WEEKLY AND/OR MONTHLY:

- Public houses: 47% of respondents (71/151)

- Post office: 29% (44/151)

- Recreation field: 21% (32/151)

Top three most desired facilities and amenities for the village (based on an average score of importance from 1-5, where 1 = most important):

Village shop: 1.9

- Post office: 2.2

 Recreation facilities for children up to 12: 2.2

PART 2 – Environment

Top four most important green spaces to households (based on an average score of importance from 1-5, where 1 = most important):

- Rural landscape with long open views to the north and east: 1.6
- Fields between Manor Road and the RAF Tactical Medical Wing: 1.7
- Country Park extension between new development and Burford Road: 1.7
- Recreation ground: 1.7

Top three ways to encourage wildlife and biodiversity (based on an average score of importance from 1-5, where 1 = most important):

- In proposed Country Park extension:1.5
- By creating a Nature Trail: 1.6
- Planting more trees: 1.6

77% of respondents (114/149) use footpaths in the surrounding countryside. 63% of respondents (81/129) think existing footpaths need enhancing or better connectivity.

83% of respondents (107/130) think there should be an information board indicating footpath routes.

Top three anti-social noise or air quality issues:

- Road traffic: 60% of respondents (71/119)

Aircraft: 57% (68/119)Air quality: 34% (40/119)

PART 3 – Character and Heritage

Top three most valuable village characteristics (based on an average score of importance from 1-5, where 1 = most important):

- The setting in a rural landscape: 1.3

 The village separation from Carterton: 1.3

Open spaces within the village: 1.4

71% of respondents (104/147) think that it is VERY IMPORTANT that the character of existing buildings, structures and layouts should be a major consideration for the design of future houses and housing development

PART 4 - You and Your Household

98% of respondents (141/144) own at least one car.

23 cars and 1 van are recorded as being parked on the public highway.

Top two locations that households live in:

- Station Road: 64% of respondents (94/146)
- Burford Road/Kilkenny Lane: 21% (30/146)

87% of respondents (128/147) are owner-occupiers

PART 5 - Housing Needs

32 respondents require a new home in Brize Norton within the next 5 years:

- 13 whole households
- 19 individuals within a household

Top two reasons for wishing to move but not being able to for both whole households and individuals:

- Unable to afford to buy new home (5 whole households/9 individuals)
- Lack of suitable housing to meet my needs (3 whole households/6 individuals)

Top reason for whole households needing a new home in Brize Norton:

- Need bigger home (7 respondents)

Top reason for individuals within a household needing a new home in Brize Norton:

Want to start first home (14 respondents)

Both whole households and individuals within a household would prefer self-ownership

PART 6 - New Housing

56% of respondents (79/142) would support NO additional planned houses in Brize Norton Top three types of housing needed in Brize Norton (based on an average score of importance from 1-5, where 1 = most important):

Low cost 1-2 bed houses: 2.1

- General market 3-4 bed houses: 2.4

Affordable 1-2 bed houses: 2.5

Top two types of development appropriate for Brize Norton:

 On infill plots only: 48% of respondents (69/143)

On other sites only: 48% (69/143)

Top two most important things to consider when deciding about the location of new housing (based on an average score of importance from 1-5, where 1 = most important):

- Prevent the merging of Carterton and Brize Norton: 1.3

- Protect centrally located greenfield land: 1.4

Top two most important other considerations (based on an average score of importance from 1-5, where 1 = most important):

Limiting the likelihood of flooding:1.2

Traffic management and access to/from site: 1.3

Top three most important things to consider about design and layout for new housing (based on an average score of importance from 1-5, where 1 = most important):

Sufficient off-road parking: 1.2

- Minimise impact on traffic: 1.2

- Minimise environmental impact: 1.4

PART 7 – Employment Land

82% of respondents (121/148) think the existing sports pavilion and associated fields at Monahan Way should NOT be replaced with employment land

63% of respondents (93/147) agree with the Viscount Court site proposal.

64% of respondents (93/146) agree with the A40/B4477 site proposal.

58% of respondents (83/143) DO NOT think employment land should be identified for B1 use within the village

73% of respondents (109/149) DO NOT think even more employment land should be identified for B1, B2 and B8 use within the village

PART 8 – Transport and Movement

Top four areas of concern about traffic volumes (based on an average score of importance from 1-5, where 1 = most important):

77% of respondents (106/138) DO NOT think current traffic calming measures are sufficient

Station Road: 1.4Manor Road: 1.8Carterton Road: 1.9Chapel Hill: 1.9

Top three areas needing traffic calming:

 Automatic speed signs on Station Road: 47% of respondents (55/116)

 Automatic speed signs on Burford Road/Kilkenny Lane: 37% (43/116)

 Automatic speed signs on Carterton Road: 35% (41/116) 70% of respondents (93/133) think there are areas where crossing the road is dangerous.

73% of respondents (98/135) think there are areas where parked vehicles are a hazard to road safety.

Top four areas of concern about large vehicles using roads (based on an average score of importance from 1-5, where 1 = most important):

Station Road: 1.8Manor Road: 2.2Chapel Hill: 2.2



51% of respondents (73/142) think the current network of pavements in Brize Norton is adequate




1. How often does your household use these village facilities?










2. Should we do more to encourage wildlife and biodiversity?












1. How many people of each age live in your household?






How many are parked on the public highway?


4. How long has your family lived in Brize Norton?

5. Which part of the village do you live in?




6. What type of accommodation do you live in?




7. Is your present home...?

8. How many bedrooms does it have?




1. Who owns the home you live in now?


2. Does your whole household or any individuals within it require a new home in Brize Norton within the next 5 years? 32 respondents


3. If you wish to move but cannot, what are the reasons preventing you?

4. Why does your household need a new home in Brize Norton?











6. How many bedrooms would your new home need?

7. Does anything affect the type of home you need?







8. Should there be white gates at all entrances to Brize Norton?



9. Where do those members of your household who work or study go to? 111 respondents – 198 total choices




10. Which mode of transport and road(s) do those members of your household, who work or study, use to leave Brize Norton by? 92 respondents – 274 total choices




11. How often do members of your household use public transport?






14. Should safe cycling routes be provided for commuting between Brize Norton and Witney?
